Subject Hickox closure

This letter is in response to docket #TR-070696

I read with interest your consideration of the closing of Hickox road as a request from BNSF. This letter is not written because this matter just so happens to be "in my back yard". This letter is to maybe enlighten you that more is at stake then making it inconvenient for those who use it and also there are other options available.

First of all, I do live on the Hickox and the following factures come into play. If you would look at an aerial map you would see that for me to get to my house in an emergency, such as flooding, all the roads would be closed because of emergency vehicles or God forbid actual flooding. Evidently the Army Core of Engineers think it will happen, they are now in the process of coming out with higher flooding maps. This road is also used by many other people and is the direct line to the hill area and or I-5. Are there other options? you bet. No one seems to care if they would go from Hickox all the way to Conway that's two and half miles. BNSF wants to only go five hundred feet beyond the Hickox and cause this much turmoil? Why can't they break the train apart? Even if they would make their train ten cars shorter, that would still make for a mile and a half long train. Or how about making an under pass? The problem is solved forever. It's done elsewhere already.
