**NOTICE SETTING ORDER CONFERENCE AND REVISING DATE FOR
COMPLIANCE FILING**

RE: *WUTC v. PacifiCorp*,
Docket No. UE-032065

TO ALL PARTIES:

PacifiCorp filed its Motion for Clarification of Final Order by Conference on November 3, 2004. WAC 480-07-840 provides:

(1) **Purpose.** The purpose of an order conference is to clarify the meaning of a final order when parties disagree about the order's meaning or requirements. Parties to an order conference may ask for clarification of the meaning of an order to:

- (a) Explore and resolve any barriers to compliance;
- (b) Ensure that any compliance filing can be accurately prepared and presented;
- (c) Propose technical changes that may be required to correct the application of principle to data; or
- (d) Correct patent error.

PacifiCorp argues that the calculation of the revenue requirement implications of rejecting paragraphs 12.b and 12.c of the Settlement Agreement appear to involve patent error that should be examined in an order conference. In addition, PacifiCorp states that an order conference is necessary to consider the application of the principles enunciated in the Order to certain corrected data.

We find that PacifiCorp has established adequate grounds in support of its Motion. Moreover, we find that an order conference is necessary to ensure that PacifiCorp's compliance filing can be accurately prepared and presented. In light of our second finding, the Commission finds good cause to postpone the date on which PacifiCorp is otherwise required by Order No. 06 to make its compliance filing. We will determine the appropriate timing following discussion with the parties at the order conference we set here for Monday, November 8, 2004, at 1:30 p.m.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That the Commission will conduct an order conference in this proceeding on Monday, November 8, 2004, at 1:30 p.m., in Room 206 at the Commission's offices in Olympia, Washington.
