Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules:  The current rules in WAC 480-15 went into effect in January 1999, after the federal government made extensive changes to the trucking industry. Changes in the industry over the past seven years, as well as our experience with the current rules, tells us we are now in a position to streamline the rules, providing greater flexibility for companies and less regulatory oversight by the UTC while still maintaining important consumer protections. The proposed rules streamline and clarify chapter 480-15 WAC.  Reasons supporting proposal:  The proposed rules:  Simplify rules where possible.  Update rules to accommodate current technology (i.e., computer-based estimates).  Align rules more closely with the federal interstate household goods carrier rules where reasonable.  Eliminate prescriptive language to allow more flexibility.  Maintain consumer protection.
