NOTICE OF VIRTUAL PREHEARING CONFERENCE (Set for May 7, 2021, at 9:30 a.m.)

- On February 15, 2019, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) entered Order 01, Instituting Special Proceeding; Complaint Seeking to Impose Penalties; Notice of Hearing (Order 01), alleging that Cascade Adventures Inc.; Cascade Adventures Baker Bus LLC, (Cascade Adventures or Company) had engaged and was engaging in unlawful operations following the cancellation of its charter and excursion carrier certificate in violation of RCW 81.70.260.
- 2 On March 12, 2019, the Commission entered Order 02, Stipulated Initial Order Classifying Respondent as Charter Party or Excursion Service Carrier; Ordering Respondent to Cease and Desist; Imposing and Suspending Penalties on Condition of Future Compliance (Order 02). Order 02 imposed a \$10,000 penalty against Cascade Adventures for violations of RCW 81.70.260(1) for advertising and operating as a charter party or excursion service carrier without the required Commission certificate. The Commission suspended an \$8,500 portion of the penalty subject to the conditions that: a) Cascade Adventures refrain from further operations as a charter party or excursion service carrier in the state of Washington without first obtaining the required certificate from the Commission, and b) the Company pay the unsuspended portion of the penalty according to an agreed payment schedule.
- 3 On August 12, 2019, the Company completed payment of the unsuspended portion of the penalty.
- 4 On March 3, 2021, Commission Staff (Staff) filed with the Commission a Motion to Impose Suspended Penalty (Motion) requesting the Commission impose the \$8,500 suspended penalty. In the Motion, Staff stated that its follow-up investigation of Cascade Adventures Staff produced evidence that the Company continued to operate as a charter

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party and excursion service carrier in the state of Washington without having obtained the required certificate from the Commission.

- 5 On March 10, 2021, Cascade Adventures filed a response to the Motion stating that it was not operating as a charter party and excursion service provider but had converted to a non-profit organization that provides transportation for members of the organization and was unaware of the Commission requirement that non-profit transportation companies must also register with the Commission.
- 6 On March 19, 2021, Staff filed a letter in this docket stating that it maintains its position that the Company continues to operate as a charter party excursion carrier without authority from the Commission. On March 23, 2021, Staff contacted the presiding officer to inform the Commission that the Company and Staff continue to disagree regarding Cascade Adventures' operations, and requested that the Commission set the matter for prehearing conference.
- 7 PROCEDURES: The Commission will hear this matter under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), particularly Part IV of RCW 34.05 relating to adjudications. The provisions of the APA that relate to this proceeding include, but are not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.422, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. The Commission will also follow its procedural rules in WAC 480-07 in this proceeding.
 - 8 THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That it will hold a virtual prehearing conference in this matter at 9:30 a.m. on May 7, 2021. - 9 PURPOSE: The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider requests for intervention, to resolve scheduling matters including establishing dates for distributing evidence, to identify the issues in the proceeding, and to determine other matters to assist the Commission in resolving the matter, as listed in WAC 480-07-430. The Commission will set the time and place for the evidentiary hearings at the prehearing conference or by later written notice.
- 10 **INTERVENTION**: Persons seeking to intervene in the proceeding must file written petitions to intervene at least three business days before the date of the prehearing conference. See WAC 480-07-355(a).

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- 11 **NOTICE OF APPEARANCE; INTERPRETER**: Party representatives must file notices of appearance with the Commission, as required by WAC 480-07-345(2), no later than the day before the conference. If any party needs an interpreter or other assistance, they should fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission.
- 12 THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.
