Pursuant to a Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission ("WUTC") Order approving a Settlement Stipulation and a Special Contract with Microsoft ("Special Contract"), PSE is notifying all relevant jurisdictions of the potential municipal tax consequences of certain Microsoft locations changing their power supplier. While PSE cannot provide customer-specific information such as specific customer-related energy usage or specific customer-related revenues, we can provide a high-level description of the municipal tax consequences of certain Microsoft locations purchasing their electric commodity from an alternative power supplier. The likely primary consequence is that PSE's gross receipts subject to electric B&O tax under Redmond, Code § 5.44.050 will likely decrease.

Microsoft commenced service under the Special Contract on April 1, 2019. The Microsoft Special Contract was approved by the WUTC and is publically available on the WUTC website.
