Please provide any analysis, data, and/or projections PSE has regarding the percentage of residential natural gas customers that would lease a 95 percent efficient gas furnace as opposed to an 80 percent efficient furnace. If a specific study, analysis, or source was relied upon, please provide a copy of and/or link to the source, study or analysis.

Response:

As detailed on page 17 of in the Prefiled Direct Testimony of Ahmad Faruqui, Ph.D., Puget Sound Energy ("PSE") assumed that approximately "80 percent [of residential structures] have viable housing stock for the [95% efficient gas furnace] equipment". This assumption was conservatively based on feedback from external experts, and was not the result of a detailed analysis.

Attached as Attachment A to PSE's Response to Public Counsel Data Request No. 035 is a PDF document of an email exchange, which was used to inform the PSE input assumption that is noted above.
