Pursuant to WAC § 480-07-355, Microsoft Corporation ("Microsoft") hereby

petitions the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission ("WUTC" or "Commission")

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The administrative rules at issue are WAC § 480-07-340, -355.

On February 19, 2020, PSE filed an application that seeks a Commission order authorizing the sale of PSE's interests in Colstrip Unit 4 and the Colstrip Transmission System, as well as approval of a power purchase agreement with NorthWestern Energy (the "Proposed Transactions"). Microsoft takes delivery service from PSE pursuant to a special contract the Commission approved in Docket No. UE-161123. The Commission-approved stipulation in that docket reserves for other proceedings a determination of Microsoft's potential obligation to contribute to decommissioning and remediation costs associated with PSE's interest in Colstrip.^{1/} The Proposed Transactions under review in this proceeding define the scope of PSE's decommissioning and remediation cost responsibility for Colstrip Unit 4. Accordingly, the Proposed Transactions, if approved, may have a direct and substantial impact on the amount of decommissioning and remediation costs ultimately allocated to Microsoft.

The Commission convened a prehearing conference in this docket on March 13, 2020. Pursuant to WAC § 480-07-355(1)(a), the deadline to intervene in this proceeding was three days earlier than the prehearing conference for this matter. Pursuant to WAC § 480-07-355(1)(b), Microsoft has good cause for making a late-filed petition to intervene. Microsoft's substantial interest in this proceeding, discussed above, was not readily apparent from PSE's filing. The potential implications of the Proposed Transactions on Microsoft's ultimate responsibility for decommissioning and remediation costs associated with Colstrip required investigation of the transaction documents and the net benefit analyses PSE performed when evaluating whether to enter into the Proposed Transactions. Microsoft has requested to intervene in this docket prior to the filing of responsive testimony in this case, and Microsoft accepts the procedural schedule adopted in Order 02 in this docket. Therefore, Microsoft's intervention will not unduly delay this proceeding, nor does Microsoft seek to broaden the issues in this proceeding. Finally, Microsoft has contacted PSE, Commission Staff, and Public Counsel, and none of these parties objects to Microsoft's intervention.

As described above, Microsoft has a direct and substantial interest in this proceeding that will not be adequately represented by any other party, and may be affected by any Commission determination made in connection with this proceeding. Thus, it is in the public interest to allow Microsoft to intervene in this proceeding.

WHEREFORE, Microsoft respectfully petitions the Commission for leave to intervene in this proceeding.
