TO ALL PARTIES:

On February 19, 2020, Puget Sound Energy (PSE or Company) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) an Application for an Order Authorizing the Sale of All of PSE's Interests in Colstrip Unit 4 and Certain of PSE's Interests in the Colstrip Transmission System (Application).

On March 13, 2020, the Commission held a prehearing conference in this matter. On March 23, 2020, the Commission entered Order 02, Prehearing Conference Order, which, among other things, established a procedural schedule and granted timely petitions to intervene filed by the Alliance of Western Energy Consumers, Avista Corporation, d/b/a Avista Utilities, Natural Resources Defense Council, NW Energy Coalition, PacifiCorp, d/b/a Pacific Power & Light Company, Portland General Electric, Renewable Northwest, and the Sierra Club.

On April 30, 2020, Microsoft Corporation (Microsoft) filed with the Commission a Late-filed Petition to Intervene pursuant to WAC 480-07-355(1)(b) (Petition). Microsoft indicated in its Petition that PSE, Commission staff, and the Public Counsel Unit of the Washington Attorney General's Office do not object to Microsoft's intervention.

Pursuant to WAC 480-07-355(2), the Commission affords the parties until May 8, 2020, to file written responses to Microsoft's Petition.
