COMMISSION STAFF'S MOTION TO
IMPOSE SUSPENDED PENALTIES

I. INTRODUCTION

1 Commission Staff (Staff) of the Washington Utilities and Transportation
Commission (Commission) submits this Motion to Impose Suspended Penalties pursuant to
WAC 480- 07-375(1).

II. RELIEF REQUESTED

2 Staff requests that the Commission impose the \$9,000 suspended penalty amount
from Order 02 of Docket TE-180401 because Seattle 7 Days Limo (“Seattle 7 Days Limo”
or “the Company”) has violated a condition of Order 02.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

3 On January 14, 2019, the Commission issued Order 02 in Docket TE-180401. In
Order 02, the Commission assessed a penalty of \$10,000 against the Company. The
Commission suspended \$9,000 of this penalty subject to several conditions. One of those
conditions is that the Company “pay[] the remaining \$1,000 penalty or file[] jointly with
Staff a proposed payment arrangement no later than 10 days from the effective date of this
Order.” Order 02 stated that the effective date of the Order was January 14, 2019.

4 On January 17, 2019, Seattle 7 Days Limo was served with Order 02 via certified
and first class mail at 22826 80th Avenue W., Edmonds, WA 98026.

5 On March 6, 2019, Staff contacted the Commission’s Financial Services Division to
inquire if Seattle 7 Days Limo had paid the \$1,000 penalty, and was informed that the
Company has not submitted any payment. On March 6, 2019, Staff searched the
Commission’s records and found that Seattle 7 Days Limo had failed to make any payment
in regard to the \$1,000 penalty. As of March 7, 2019, Staff has determined that Seattle 7
Days Limo has not contacted Staff to propose payment arrangements of the \$1,000 penalty.

III. STATEMENT OF ISSUES

6 Should the Commission impose the \$9,000 penalty suspended in Order 02 given that
Seattle 7 Days Limo has failed to meet a condition of the penalty suspension?

IV. EVIDENCE RELIED UPON

7 Staff relies upon the Declaration of Investigator Jason Hoxit, which is filed
contemporaneously with this Motion.

V. ARGUMENT

8 On January 17, 2019, the Commission suspended \$9,000 in penalties against the
Company subject to the condition that the Company either pay the \$1,000 penalty or jointly
file with Staff a proposed payment arrangement no later than 10 days from the effective date
of Order 02. Staff recommends that the suspended penalties in Order 02 be imposed against
Seattle 7 Days Limo because the Company has failed to timely pay the \$1,000 penalty or
contact Staff regarding a proposed payment arrangement.

VI. CONCLUSION

9 Staff respectfully requests that the Commission grant its Motion to Impose
Suspended Penalties and impose the full \$9,000 suspended penalty against the Company.
