Please consider that the closure of Hickok puts additional traffic burdens on the residents for miles between Mount Vernon and Conway, it remover the Flood evacuation Route for all the Residents to the north along with severe health risks for delayed responses to our seniors already living within the district, who currently depend on Cederdale Fire Department and emergency aid car services. Think about your own grandmother waiting for help.

We just had (May 17?/07) a horrific fire at the old Veal Pride Building on the 1600 Block of Dike Road in which was necessary for a dual Fire District response. There is no perhaps Conway could have helped alone.

We challenge you to involve the DOT's input who had to literally have a two Man safety Traffic Patrol at the Conway intersection on week ends the entire month or six weeks of Tulip season in April/ May which local traffic is diverted to surrounding roads.
