| 3 | JUDGE MOSS: Let's be on the record. Good |
| 4 | morning, everyone. We are convened today in what I |
| 5 | believe is our first prehearing conference in three |
| 6 | dockets that I believe are not consolidated at this |
| 7 | juncture, although we can talk about the |
| 8 | advisability of that later. |
| 9 | These are petitions, each of these involves |
| 10 | petitions by Verizon Northwest, Inc. for waiver of |
| 11 | Washington Administrative Code Section 480-120-071 |
| 12 | (2)(a.) Our docket numbers are UT061298, UT061464, |
| 13 | and UT061821. |
| 14 | As to one of these, that would be the |
| 15 | 061821, there is pending a motion to withdraw which |
| 16 | we will take up momentarily. |
| 17 | Our first order of business, however, with |
| 18 | that preliminary out of the way, is to take the |
| 19 | appearances of counsel. And, Mr. Dixon, your |
| 20 | client is the applicant, so I will start with you. |
| 21 | This is our first prehearing so we'll ask |
| 22 | you to give your full name, spelling your last name |
| 23 | for the court reporter's benefit, your title, your |
| 24 | client, your address, street address, and your |

phone number, fax number, and e-mail.

- 1 MR. DIXON: Thank you, Your Honor. I am
- 2 Thomas F. Dixon, D-i-x-o-n. I am the assistant
- 3 general counsel for the Northwest Region for
- 4 Verizon. I represent Verizon Northwest, Inc. I am
- 5 located at 707 17th Street, that's 1-7 Street,
- 6 No. 4200, Denver, Colorado 80202. My telephone
- 7 number is (303) 390-6206. My fax number is (303)
- 8 390-6333. My toll-free number is (888) 475-7218,
- 9 extension 3. And my e-mail address is
- 10 thomas.f.dixon@verizon.com.
- 11 JUDGE MOSS: Thank you, Mr. Dixon.
- MR. DIXON: You are welcome.
- JUDGE MOSS: Ms. Cameron-Rulkowski.
- 14 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Jennifer
- 15 Cameron-Rulkowski, Assistant Attorney General. The
- 16 address is 1400 South Evergreen Park Drive,
- 17 Southwest, Olympia, Washington 98504-0128.
- 18 Telephone is (360) 664-1186. Fax is
- 19 (360) 586-5522. And my e-mail is
- 20 jcameron@wutc.wa.gov.
- 21 JUDGE MOSS: Thank you. I think in terms of
- 22 our order of business, the most logical thing to do
- 23 would be to take up first the motion to withdraw.
- 24 I have looked at the papers in my file. One
- 25 perhaps significant piece that I don't get is that

- 1 I understand there was a Staff briefing memo to the
- 2 Commission for purposes of the open meeting that
- 3 may include some data that would answer my
- 4 questions. I haven't seen that, so I will ask my
- 5 questions.
- 6 And specifically in connection with the
- 7 motion to withdraw the application, or petition for
- 8 waiver in UT 061821, I want to clarify for my
- 9 benefit before I rule, or decide to hold the matter
- 10 in abeyance for further discussions internally,
- 11 that this petition concerns -- is it four
- 12 customers, Mr. Dixon?
- MR. DIXON: That's correct, Your Honor.
- 14 JUDGE MOSS: And I was reading through the
- 15 application and its various amendments, and it
- 16 appears to me that the end story is that for these
- 17 four, we would be looking at a cost -- or Verizon
- 18 would be facing a cost of approximately \$57,000.
- 19 MR. DIXON: That would be the total cost
- 20 with the reinforcement and everything that would be
- 21 involved for these four customers. And I want to
- 22 make it clear, the original petition, of course,
- 23 included the Bush property. And when the
- 24 Commission bifurcated these cases, we're down to
- 25 these four customers in this particular docket.

- 1 So for that group of customers the cost is
- 2 about \$57,000 now.
- JUDGE MOSS: Yes, I will confess I became
- 4 confused with the \$163,000 figure, so I figured
- 5 that one out. So I appreciate your clarification.
- 6 And that is a point that is of some significance
- 7 here. Working out, I believe if I did the math
- 8 correctly, to \$14,250 on average per customer.
- 9 MR. DIXON: That's my recollection as well,
- 10 Your Honor.
- 11 JUDGE MOSS: I want to put the question to
- 12 Staff, whether this is an amount that falls
- 13 reasonably within the range of what has previously
- 14 been allowed by this Commission in terms of these
- 15 line extensions.
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Staff answers yes.
- 17 JUDGE MOSS: Thank you.
- 18 Mr. Dixon, do you have anything further you
- 19 would like to present before I rule?
- MR. DIXON: No, Your Honor.
- JUDGE MOSS: Ms. Cameron-Rulkowski, do you
- 22 have anything further to present?
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: No, Your Honor,
- 24 Staff has no objection to the withdrawal.
- 25 JUDGE MOSS: Thank you for that. I will

- 1 grant the withdrawal, and I will make that part of
- 2 my prehearing order.
- 3 MR. DIXON: Thank you, Your Honor. And
- 4 I will notify our people so we can do what is
- 5 necessary to ensure that the line extensions are
- 6 constructed.
- 7 JUDGE MOSS: Very good. With that disposed
- 8 of, I think our next matter of business will be the
- 9 schedule for the remaining requests. And I
- 10 received on the 24th from Ms. Cameron-Rulkowski the
- 11 apparently agreed schedule that you have all
- 12 arrived at through your discussions.
- 13 And I would like to say, first of all, I
- 14 think this is an excellent practice, one that I
- 15 heartily endorse, and would like to see more of in
- 16 future cases. I have looked at my calendar and I
- 17 am going to confirm, once again, that the hearing,
- 18 May 22nd and 23rd -- I knew there was a point I
- 19 wanted to raise. There was a reason I wanted to
- 20 look at that.
- 21 The 23rd is an open meeting day, so that
- 22 does not preclude us from having the hearing on
- 23 that day; it just means this room is unavailable.
- 24 I gather -- and I haven't asked, but my sense of
- 25 things is there's no one else on the telephone line

- 1 that wishes to intervene in this proceeding?
- 2 (No response.)
- JUDGE MOSS: Apparently not.
- 4 MR. DIXON: This is Tom Dixon. We have
- 5 received no pleadings so indicating.
- 6 JUDGE MOSS: So I have no pleadings, so I
- 7 wanted to bring that to your attention. It's not
- 8 an issue. We can have the hearing in room 108,
- 9 given the small number of players. So if those are
- 10 the dates you prefer, I can do that.
- 11 MR. DIXON: Thank you, Your Honor. We have
- 12 selected two days to give ourselves time in the
- 13 event we ran over. Our goal would be to finish in
- 14 one day.
- 15 JUDGE MOSS: I also think it's wise to have
- 16 an extra half day or day reserve. The other
- 17 matters on the procedural schedule don't
- 18 necessarily involve my involvement, and so I don't
- 19 see anything here that conflicts with my calendar.
- 20 And I would be willing to adopt the procedural
- 21 schedule that the parties have proposed. If there
- 22 are any changes, you should let me know now.
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: No changes, Your
- 24 Honor, on behalf of Staff.
- MR. DIXON: Not on behalf of Verizon, Your

- 1 Honor.
- JUDGE MOSS: Very good. I will publish that
- 3 schedule as part of my prehearing order.
- 4 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Thank you, Your
- 5 Honor.
- 6 JUDGE MOSS: Yes, thank you. Is there any
- 7 other business we need to take up today?
- 8 MR. DIXON: This is Tom Dixon. I don't know
- 9 of anything else at this point that I have. We
- 10 have talked -- Jennifer and I spoke briefly about a
- 11 protective order. And should that be needed,
- 12 we will request one, and request a standard
- 13 protective order from the Commission at that time.
- 14 But that will depend on whatever discovery goes on.
- We will certainly cooperate in getting a
- 16 protective order, so to the extent there is any
- 17 confidential information requested, that it would
- 18 get expedited getting that to the parties, or the
- 19 parties can share that type of data.
- JUDGE MOSS: Okay. And, Mr. Dixon, you
- 21 don't appear here on a regular basis, but I do want
- 22 to say, we do use surnames in the hearing room
- 23 because of the transcript. It's necessary to do
- 24 that to have a clear transcript.
- 25 MR. DIXON: I apologize. I stumbled for a

- 1 minute because I didn't have my paper with
- 2 Ms. Cameron-Rulkowski's name in front of me, her
- 3 last name, so I apologize.
- 4 JUDGE MOSS: That's quite all right.
- 5 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Your Honor, Staff
- 6 would like to invoke the standard discovery.
- 7 JUDGE MOSS: I have a slightly different
- 8 view of that whole process than some others, but
- 9 that's no problem. You can proceed with discovery
- in accordance with the Commission's rules.
- 11 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Thank you.
- 12 JUDGE MOSS: Is there anything else? I
- 13 should tell you on formal filings, you do need to
- 14 file through the Records Center, addressing your
- 15 papers to the Secretary, Records Center. I
- 16 unfortunately did not check with the Records Center
- 17 before coming in today as to the requisite number
- 18 of copies that we need. I will do that and include
- 19 that information in the prehearing order.
- The default number, I think, is 12, but we
- 21 can sometimes make that fewer, and in rare cases we
- 22 have to expand that. But I will see if I can cut
- 23 that down for you.
- 24 And the pace of things is such that --
- 25 I will just put it out there and we can get it

- 1 resolved. In terms of briefs, we sometimes have
- 2 requests to file briefs electronically followed by
- 3 paper service the next day, paper filing and
- 4 service the next day. Which is, under our rules
- 5 and indeed under our statute, we have to receive
- 6 the paper for it to be an official filing.
- 7 Do you all want the opportunity -- do you
- 8 want these days for briefs to be dates for
- 9 electronic submission, or do you want them to be
- 10 the dates in which we receive the paper?
- 11 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Electronic
- 12 submission would be fine for Staff.
- MR. DIXON: That's also fine for Verizon,
- 14 Your Honor.
- JUDGE MOSS: It's often convenient for
- 16 parties whose counsel is remote. So let's do that.
- 17 We will make the dates the 22nd of June and 13th of
- 18 July will be dates for electronic submission, and
- 19 then the paper will need to be received the next
- 20 day, next business day. I haven't checked whether
- 21 these are Fridays or not.
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: One more question,
- 23 Your Honor, if I may. We had discussed
- 24 consolidating these two petitions, Bush and Lively.
- 25 Is that contemplated now?

- 1 JUDGE MOSS: We can do that.
- 2 MR. DIXON: Your Honor, I forgot to bring
- 3 that up. I apologize.
- 4 JUDGE MOSS: I forgot about it, too, so
- 5 we're all in the same boat. Is that something the
- 6 parties see some affirmative benefit to?
- 7 MR. DIXON: Verizon would request they be
- 8 consolidated. They are similar in terms of the
- 9 issues, similar in terms of the amounts at issue,
- 10 in the terms of the line extensions as Verizon has
- 11 alleged them to be.
- 12 They also involve the same witnesses for
- 13 Verizon who are in the field normally. They are
- 14 not professional witnesses, so to speak. They are,
- 15 indeed, working on line extensions as part of their
- 16 job in the company. So we would like to keep them
- 17 on line extension activities, and less in the
- 18 courtroom. So we would recommend consolidation so
- 19 they can come in and address both cases at the same
- 20 time, thereby putting them back in the field as
- 21 soon as possible.
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Staff has no
- 23 objection to consolidating.
- 24 JUDGE MOSS: We will consolidate these
- 25 matters. And if there's some reason to enter

- 1 separate orders, we have the freedom to do that.
- 2 If there should be occasion at some point in the
- 3 future to separate the dockets, we can always do
- 4 that. So we have a lot of flexibility in this
- 5 connection, but I will include in the order
- 6 consolidation. And we will consider them on the
- 7 same schedule for the convenience of the witnesses,
- 8 and, indeed, for the judicial economy of the
- 9 Commission.
- 10 So I do appreciate you bringing that point
- 11 up. I would have walked out of here regretting
- 12 having let it slip my own mind.
- 13 MR. DIXON: Thank you, and to
- 14 Ms. Cameron-Rulkowski for reminding me, because I
- 15 actually had it on my piece of paper.
- JUDGE MOSS: Well, that does, indeed, bring
- 17 our business to a close. If you have any
- 18 questions, procedural questions along the way, you
- 19 can contact me at the Commission. And my direct
- 20 phone number is (360) 664-1164. And, of course,
- 21 you are all familiar with the ex-parte rules and
- 22 understand we can only discuss procedural matters.
- 23 But I do like to be able to give you that
- 24 opportunity should the need arise.
- 25 I am also happy to receive e-mails raising

- 1 such questions. My e-mail address is
- 2 dmoss@wutc.wa.gov. And with that, there being
- 3 nothing further --
- 4 MR. DIXON: I have nothing further on behalf
- 5 of Verizon, Your Honor. Thank you.
- 6 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Nothing further from
- 7 Staff, Your Honor.
- 8 JUDGE MOSS: Then our prehearing conference
- 9 will be adjourned. Thank you very much.
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Thank you.
