IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING YOUR ELECTRIC AND NATURAL GAS SERVICES—NOTICE OF REQUESTED RATE INCREASE AND PUBLIC HEARING

On Nov. 7 2018, Puget Sound Energy filed a request with the state Utilities and Transportation Commission (UTC) to increase rates for all electric and natural gas customer groups, effective March 7, 2019. This request updates Schedule 141 rates to recover utility operation costs PSE has made through June 30, 2018. The filing as originally submitted requests a total electric revenue increase of \$18.9 million, or 0.9 percent, and a total increase in natural gas revenue of \$21.7 million, or 2.7 percent. This filing also includes a request for a revision to PSE's electric and gas Schedule 142 Revenue Decoupling Mechanisms. PSE describes this filing as an Expedited Rate Filing (ERF).

IMPACTS OF THIS REQUEST: The impacts on a typical residential customer based on the proposed rate changes are as follows. The UTC has the authority to set final rates that may vary from PSE's requests, which may either be higher or lower depending on the results of the UTC investigation.

NATURAL GAS RATES: Based on the proposed Schedule 141 rates, a typical residential natural gas customer using 64 therms per month would see an average monthly increase of \$1.58, or 2.7 percent.

ELECTRIC RATES: Based on the proposed Schedule 141 rates, a typical residential electric customer using 900 kwhs per month would see an average monthly increase of \$1.00, or 1.1 percent.
