COMMISSION STAFF'S RESPONSE IN SUPPORT OF AT&T'S MOTION TO COMPEL

The Commission Staff (Staff) supports the motion of AT&T Communications of the Pacific Northwest, Inc. (AT&T) for an order compelling Qwest Corporation (Qwest) to respond to its data request 001-002.

AT&T's data request 001-002 asks Qwest to produce information regarding the location of Qwest's customers. This request is directly relevant to the issues in this

docket. The purpose of this proceeding is to update unbundled network element

(UNE) costs, including the UNE loop. The loop cost models currently use proxy data

for customer locations, which results in a certain amount of imprecision in the \cos

estimates. The customer location information will reduce the amount of imprecision in

the cost estimates.

Qwest objected to AT&T's request on the grounds that the request is "overly broad and that providing substantive responses would be unduly burdensome, and

would require an extensive, time-consuming and unduly expensive special study."

STAFF'S RESPONSE IN SUPPORT OF MOTION TO COMPEL - 1 AT&T's Motion to Compel, Exhibit D. Qwest later provided line count information, but

no customer location information. AT&T's Motion to Compel, at 2.

Commission Staff agrees with AT&T's arguments. The customer location

information is probative of the cost of the loop. The probative value of this evidence

outweighs the burdens that Qwest argues are associated with producing it.

In addition, Verizon already has produced the required information, and Qwest

apparently has produced the information for the Arizona Commission. Therefore, Staff

does not find Qwest's objection credible.

The Commission Staff supports AT&T's motion. The Commission should issue

an order compelling Qwest to respond to AT&T's data request 001-002 within the next 4

weeks.
