- 5 JUDGE KOPTA: And for Boise White Paper.
- 6 MR. COWELL: Your Honor, Jesse Cowell
- 7 appearing on behalf of Boise White Paper, LLC.
- 8 JUDGE KOPTA: Anyone else wishing to make an
- 9 appearance? Hearing none, that seems like our cast of
- 10 characters.
- 11 First order of business is interventions.
- 12 The only petition that the Commission has received is
- 13 from Boise White Paper. Anyone else wishing to
- 14 intervene? Apparently not. Any objections to the
- 15 intervention of Boise White Paper? None, then we will
- 16 admit them and grant that petition for intervention.
- 17 The second order of business is discovery.
- 18 I assume that's primarily the reason that we're here,
- 19 Commission's discovery rules to be available.
- 20 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Yes, please, and we
- 21 had -- we would also suggest that if you're amenable
- 22 that we place in the prehearing conference order that
- 23 all parties are required to serve all other parties with
- 24 responses to discovery.
- JUDGE KOPTA: So that our first data

- 1 request -- or your first data request doesn't have to be
- 2 please send us all responses. Yes, we will include
- 3 that. And do we need a protective order?
- 4 MR. KUMAR: Yes.
- 5 MR. MCVEE: Yes, Your Honor. We've already
- 6 filed a motion for protective order in this proceeding.
- 7 JUDGE KOPTA: Okay. Then we will issue the
- 8 standard protective order.
- 9 And then unless anyone has anything else,
- 10 then we deal with schedule, which it looks like a
- 11 settlement conference on December 7th and 8th.
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: I'm sorry, that
- 13 should be 7th or 8th.
- JUDGE KOPTA: 7th or 8th, okay. Well, that
- 15 makes more sense unless you're going to have protracted
- 16 discussions.
- 17 Then Staff, Public Counsel, and intervenor
- 18 direct testimony on January 5th, 2018; rebuttal
- 19 testimony from the Company and cross-answering testimony
- 20 from the other parties on February 16th; then
- 21 cross-examination, exhibits, witness list, and time
- 22 estimates on March 22nd.
- 23 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Your Honor, before
- 24 that, we have a discovery cutoff that's handwritten in
- 25 there.

- 1 JUDGE KOPTA: Okay. Discovery cutoff on
- 2 March 12th. Then a hearing on a date to be determined
- 3 sometime between March 28th and April 5th, and I
- 4 understand from the Company that they would prefer that
- 5 whatever date would not be on Monday or Friday, and then
- 6 post-hearing briefing.
- 7 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: And that date is May
- 8 10th.
- 9 JUDGE KOPTA: May 10th. That would be
- 10 simultaneous briefs, single round?
- 11 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Correct.
- 12 JUDGE KOPTA: Okay. Well, we can always
- 13 rediscuss that closer to the time. And then I note that
- 14 after Staff, Public Counsel, and intervenors file their
- 15 direct testimony that discovery will be on a
- 16 seven-day -- seven business-day turnaround; is that
- 17 correct? From that point on until the discovery cutoff?
- 18 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: That's correct, Your
- 19 Honor.
- MR. KUMAR: That's correct.
- JUDGE KOPTA: Okay. All right. Seems fine
- 22 to me. I will check with my calendar and the
- 23 Commission's calendar and see what would be a good
- 24 hearing day and let you know as part of the prehearing
- 25 conference order.
