#### **BACKGROUND**

- On October 29, 2003, The Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway Company filed a petition with the Commission, seeking approval to modify train detection circuitry at a railroad-highway grade crossing. The crossing is located at the intersection of the Petitioner's tracks and 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue NE, in Quincy, Washington.
- Respondent has consented to an entry of an Order by the Commission without further notice or hearing.
- Warning devices at the 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue NE crossing consist of shoulder-mounted signals with gates, activated by DC-type train detection circuitry. Petitioner proposes to replace the existing circuitry with constant warning circuitry due to impending train speed increases. The upgrade will improve the efficiency and reliability of the grade crossing warning system.

#### FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

- 4 (1) The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission is an agency of the State of Washington having jurisdiction over public railroad-highway grade crossings within the state of Washington. *Chapter 81.53 RCW*.
- 5 (2) The 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue NE crossing, designated as USDOT 065799A is a public railroad-highway grade crossing within the state of Washington.
- 6 (3) WAC 480-62-150(2)(d) requires that the Commission grant approval prior to making any changes to train detection circuitry at public railroadhighway grade crossings within the state of Washington.
- 7 (4) Commission Staff investigated the petition and recommended that it be granted.
- 8 (5) This matter was brought before the Commission at its regularly scheduled meeting on November 12, 2003.
- 9 (6) After examination of the petition filed by the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway Company on October 29, 2003, and giving consideration to all relevant matters and for good cause shown, the Commission grants the petition.

### ORDER

## THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

The petition of the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway Company for modification of train detection circuitry at a public railroad-highway grade crossing located at the intersection of 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue NE and the Petitioner's tracks, in Quincy, Washington, is granted.

The Commissioners, having determined that this filing complies with the requirements of WAC 480-62-150, directed the Secretary to enter this Order.
