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PURPOSE, SCOPE, AND AUTHORITY

Purpose

The purpose of this investigation is to determine if Daniel John Busby d/b/a Careful Movers, Inc. (Careful Movers) is operating motor vehicles for transportation of property for compensation (operating as a household goods carrier) on the public highways of the state of Washington without the necessary permit authority required for such operations by RCW 81.80.070.

Scope

The scope of the investigation focuses on information obtained by staff of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (commission) relating to the business practices of Careful Movers.

Authority

Staff undertakes this investigation under the authority of the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 81.01.010, which adopts RCW 80.01, which directs the commission to regulate auto transportation companies in the public interest, and to adopt such rules and regulations as may be necessary to do so. In addition, RCW 81.04.070 makes it clear that the commission is authorized to conduct such an investigation.¹

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The commission's Business Practices Investigations staff investigated information it received alleging Careful Movers transported household goods for compensation in Washington without the required permit.

Based on the information obtained in this investigation, staff finds that Careful Movers violated state law by transporting household goods for compensation without a permit from the commission.

Staff recommends the commission issue a \$1,500 penalty to Careful Movers, as provided under RCW 81.80.070(4), for one violation of RCW 81.80.070(1), operating a motor vehicle for transportation of property for compensation on the public highways of the state of Washington without the necessary permit required for such operation.

Staff also recommends the commission initiate a proceeding against Careful Movers as provided by RCW 81.04.510.

Finally, staff recommends that the commission refer the matter to the county prosecuting attorney for prosecution of Careful Movers under the motor carrier unlawful advertising statute, RCW 81.80.355.

Total recommended penalties: \$1,500

BACKGROUND

Company information

On January 1, 1995, an account was opened with Washington State Department of Revenue (DOR) for Daniel J. Busby d/b/a Careful & Courteous Movers, Unified Business Identifier (UBI) 601-589-461. The business location and mailing address were listed as 15015 Highway 99, Suite A, Lynnwood, Washington 98037-5019. The account was closed on September 30, 2003. Department of Licensing (DOL) records indicate UBI 601-589-461 was issued to Daniel John Busby d/b/a Careful Movers at the Lynnwood address.

On July 1, 2002, an account was opened with DOR for Careful Movers, Inc., UBI 602-214-860. The business location is listed as 15015 Highway 99, #A, Lynnwood, Washington 98037 and the mailing address is 12529 Highway 99, Everett, Washington 98204-5506. The account remains open today².

However, a records search at Secretary of State for UBI 602-214-860, registered in the name of Careful Movers, Inc., indicates the filing to be inactive. Further information obtained from the Secretary of State indicates the corporation was administratively dissolved on July 23, 2002, and no reports were filed by Careful Movers after incorporating on June 21, 2002. A note in the file states, "Administratively dissolved on 7/23/2002 for unrecovered NSF/account closed fees." ³

Previous Enforcement Action by Commission

On February 8, 2000, the commission issued two penalty assessments against Careful Movers. In Penalty Assessment No. 99781, the commission assessed a \$1,500 penalty for three violations relating to advertising as a public service company without holding a permit to operate as such. In Penalty Assessment No. 10034, the commission assessed a \$1,500 penalty for operating as a common carrier of household goods without a permit to do so. The commission simultaneously ordered Careful Movers to cease and desist from operating as a household goods carrier in the state of Washington. Records indicate Careful Movers requested mitigation of Penalty Assessment No. 10034. The commission assigned the matter Docket No. TV-000418 and set it for a brief adjudicatory proceeding.

The parties subsequently entered into settlement negotiations and eventually reached an agreement on July 31, 2000. As part of the settlement agreement approved on September 7, 2000, Careful Movers filed an application for a temporary household goods permit and paid a reduced penalty amount of \$1500 in full settlement of both Penalty Assessment No. 99781 and No. 10034⁴. The commission rescinded the order requiring Careful Movers to cease and desist operating as a household goods carrier in the state of Washington. On May 18, 2000, Careful Movers filed Application No. P-78912 for temporary household goods moving authority. The commission granted the application on September 11, 2000, issuing Careful Movers Temporary Permit No. TCC-11879.

On May 3, 2002, Careful Movers filed an application requesting permanent authority to operate as a household goods carrier in the state of Washington. Permanent authority was granted on August 6, 2003. Careful Movers was issued Permit No. HG-11879.

Careful Movers' 2003 annual report, filed with the commission on May 3, 2004, reflected its UBI number to be 601-589-461. The regulatory fee calculation sheet that accompanied the annual report indicated Careful Movers' total gross intrastate operating revenue to be \$851,345.90 for the year 2003. Careful Movers paid the commission \$2,128.37 in regulatory fees.

In 2005, Careful Movers failed to file its 2004 annual report or pay its 2005 regulatory fee. As a result, Careful Movers' permit was canceled by the commission on February 9, 2006, under docket number TV-051482⁵.

On February 17, 2006, Special Investigator John Foster visited Careful Movers at 12529 Highway 99 in Everett, Washington. He spoke directly with Mr. Busby and his office manager, Shane Anderson. During his visit, Mr. Foster spoke with Mr. Busby and Mr. Anderson regarding Mr. Busby's failure to respond to commission correspondence requesting information and a transfer application due to the apparent incorporation of the business. WAC 480-15-400 requires a household goods carrier to file a name change application if a carrier wants to change the name on the permit, corporate name, trade name, or add a trade name to the permit.

In addition, Mr. Foster notified Mr. Busby and Mr. Anderson that Careful Movers was required to notify the commission of the company's business address change and that Careful Movers' household goods permit number is to be included in all of Careful Movers' advertising.

Mr. Busby and Mr. Anderson said Careful Movers would immediately change its advertising to include the company's permit number. Mr. Foster provided Mr. Busby with an application to reinstate permit HG-11879. Mr. Busby stated that he would file the application as well as the 2004 annual report and pay all regulatory fees due as soon as possible. Mr. Busby also acknowledged the requirement that he file an application to transfer his permit into the company's new name.

On February 21, 2006, the commission sent Careful Movers a letter detailing what the cancellation meant and directing the company to cease operations immediately⁶.

As of the date of this report, Careful Movers has not filed an application with the commission to reinstate HG-11879, nor did it file its 2004 annual report or pay the appropriate regulatory fees.

INVESTIGATION

Customer complaint

On July 3, 2007, the commission's Consumer Affairs staff received a complaint against Careful Movers. Customer Colleen Kelly contacted the commission regarding her December 23, 2006, move conducted by Careful Movers. Careful Movers moved Ms. Kelly's household goods from 12508 Lake City Way Northeast, #517, Seattle, Washington 98125 to 417 East Pine Street, #209, Seattle, Washington 98122.

In her complaint, Ms. Kelly claims that Careful Movers refused to move three bookshelves to her new residence, stating they would not fit in the elevator, stairwell or through the windows. Ms. Kelly then paid Careful Movers \$85 an hour to return the bookshelves to her previous residence where she placed them in paid storage. Later, after deciding the bookshelves would indeed fit through the elevator and stairwell at her new residence, Ms. Kelly requested Careful Movers return and complete her move. Careful Movers declined, resulting in Ms. Kelly having to hire additional labor and moving the bookshelves herself on March 30, 2007. In her complaint, Ms. Kelly sought restitution for the cost of the laborers (\$200) and three months of storage fees for the bookshelves (\$75)⁷.

Because Ms. Kelly's complaint was a damage complaint and therefore non-jurisdictional to the commission, Consumer Affairs staff did not attempt to contact Careful Movers to investigate and resolve the complaint. Instead, on July 5, 2007, staff opened a complaint for Ms. Kelly and gathered information and documents from Ms. Kelly to demonstrate Careful Movers did perform a household goods move although it is not currently permitted to do so in the state of Washington.

On July 7, 2007, Ms. Kelly drove to Careful Movers' office and picked up a check for \$245. The company claimed it sent a prior check in the mail to Ms. Kelly and, when issuing the second check, deducted \$30 for the stop-check fee it had to place on the missing check. Ms. Kelly was unsatisfied with the partial refund.

Investigation

This matter was referred to Business Practices Investigations for further investigation of Careful Movers' alleged operation as a household goods carrier without a permit from the commission.

On August 14, 2007, I contacted Ms. Kelly and requested she fill out and sign a declaration regarding her experience with Careful Movers. On August 15, 2007, Ms. Kelly submitted the declaration via fax ⁸.

Advertising

Careful Movers appears to be operating a Web site at http://www.carefulmovers.net. The site states, "Whether you're moving a small household or a 100 person office, Careful Movers is the company for the job." The company is also listed in at least four online telephone directories (Dex Online, AT&T's AnyWho.com, Superpages.com and WhitePages.com) for Lynnwood and Everett¹⁰.

Staff called the following telephone numbers for Careful Movers on August 15, 2007:

At each number, a man answered the phone, stating, "Careful Movers".

CONCLUSIONS

RCW 81.80.070 Grant or denial of permit, states, in part:

- (1) No "common carrier," "contract carrier," or "temporary carrier" shall operate for the transportation of property for compensation in this state without first obtaining from the commission a permit to do so.
- (4) A common carrier, contract carrier, or temporary carrier operating without the permit required in subsection (1) of this section...is subject to a penalty...of one thousand five hundred dollars.

Based on the information obtained in this investigation, staff finds that Careful Movers violated RCW 81.80.070 on December 23, 2006, by transporting household goods for compensation on the public highways of the state of Washington without the necessary permit required for such operations.

RCW 81.80.355 Unlawful advertising, states:

Any person not holding a permit authorizing him to operate as a common carrier, contract carrier, or temporary carrier for the transportation of property for compensation in this state, or an exempt carrier, who displays on any building, vehicle, billboard or in any manner, any advertisement of, or by circular, letter, newspaper, magazine, poster, card or telephone directory, advertises the transportation of property for compensation shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable as such.

Staff finds Careful Movers is violating RCW 81.080.355 by currently advertising household goods moving services without the necessary permit.

RCW 81.04.510 Engaging in business or operating without approval or authority — Procedure, states, in part:

Whenever the commission believes that any person or corporation is engaged in operations without the necessary approval or authority required by any provision of this title, it may institute a special proceeding requiring such person or corporation to appear before the commission at a location convenient for witnesses and the production of evidence and bring with him books, records, accounts and other memoranda, and give testimony under oath as to his operations or acts, and the burden shall rest upon such person or corporation of proving that his operations or acts are not subject to the provisions of this chapter.

Recommendations

Staff recommends the commission issue a \$1,500 penalty to Careful Movers, as provided under RCW 81.80.070(4), for one violation of RCW 81.80.070.

Staff also recommends the commission initiate a proceeding against Careful Movers as provided by RCW 81.04.510.

Finally, staff recommends that the commission refer the matter to the county prosecuting attorney for prosecution of Careful Movers under the motor carrier unlawful advertising statute, RCW 81.80.355.

Total recommended penalties: \$1,500

APPENDIX A

RCW 81.01.010

Adoption of provisions of chapter 80.01 RCW.

The provisions of chapter 80.01 RCW, as now or hereafter amended, apply to Title 81 RCW as fully as though they were set forth herein. [1961 c 14 § 81.01.010.]

RCW 80.01.040

General powers and duties of commission.

The utilities and transportation commission shall:

- (1) Exercise all the powers and perform all the duties prescribed therefor by this title and by Title 81 RCW, or by any other law.
- (2) Regulate in the public interest, as provided by the public service laws, the rates, services, facilities, and practices of all persons engaging in the transportation by whatever means of persons or property within this state for compensation, and related activities; including, but not limited to, air transportation companies, auto transportation companies, express companies, freight and freight line companies, motor freight companies, motor transportation agents, private car companies, railway companies, sleeping car companies, steamboat companies, street railway companies, toll bridge companies, storage warehousemen, and wharfingers and warehousemen.
- (3) Regulate in the public interest, as provided by the public service laws, the rates, services, facilities, and practices of all persons engaging within this state in the business of supplying any utility service or commodity to the public for compensation, and related activities; including, but not limited to, electrical companies, gas companies, irrigation companies, telecommunications companies, and water companies.
- (4) Make such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out its other powers and duties.

RCW 81.04.070

Inspection of books, papers, and documents.

The commission and each commissioner, or any person employed by the commission, shall have the right, at any and all times, to inspect the accounts, books, papers and documents of any public service company, and the commission, or any commissioner, may examine under oath any officer, agent or employee of such public service company in relation thereto, and with reference to the affairs of such company: PROVIDED, That any person other than a commissioner who shall make any such demand shall produce his authority from the commission to make such inspection. [1961 c 14 § 81.04.070. Prior: 1911 c 117 § 77; RRS § 10415.]

RCW 81.04.510

Engaging in business or operating without approval or authority — Procedure.

Whether or not any person or corporation is conducting business requiring operating authority, or has performed or is performing any act requiring approval of the commission without securing such approval, shall be a question of fact to be determined by the commission. Whenever the commission believes that any person or corporation is engaged in operations without the necessary approval or authority required by any provision of this title, it may institute a special proceeding requiring such person or corporation to appear before the commission at a location convenient for witnesses and the production of evidence and bring with him books, records, accounts and other memoranda, and give testimony under oath as to his operations or acts, and the burden shall rest upon such person or corporation of proving that his operations or acts are not subject to the provisions of this chapter. The commission may consider any and all facts that may indicate the true nature and extent of the operations or acts and may subpoena such witnesses and documents as it deems necessary.

After having made the investigation herein described, the commission is authorized and directed to issue the necessary order or orders declaring the operations or acts to be subject to, or not subject to, the provisions of this title. In the event the operations or acts are found to be subject to the provisions of this title, the commission is authorized and directed to issue cease and desist orders to all parties involved in the operations or acts.

In proceedings under this section no person or corporation shall be excused from testifying or from producing any book, waybill, document, paper or account before the commission when ordered to do so, on the ground that the testimony or evidence, book, waybill, document, paper or account required of him may tend to incriminate him or subject him to penalty or forfeiture; but no person or corporation shall be prosecuted, punished or subjected to any penalty or forfeiture for or on account of any account, transaction, matter or thing concerning which he shall under oath have testified or produced documentary evidence in proceedings under this section: PROVIDED, That no person so testifying shall be exempt from prosecution or punishment for any perjury committed by him in his testimony.

RCW 81.80.070

Grant or denial of permit — Cease and desist orders — Penalty.

- (1) No "common carrier," "contract carrier," or "temporary carrier" shall operate for the transportation of property for compensation in this state without first obtaining from the commission a permit so to do. Permits heretofore issued or hereafter issued to any carrier, shall be exercised by said carrier to the fullest extent so as to render reasonable service to the public. Applications for common or contract carrier permits or extensions thereof shall be on file for a period of at least thirty days prior to the granting thereof unless the commission finds that special conditions require the earlier granting thereof.
- (2) A permit or extension thereof shall be issued to any qualified applicant therefor, authorizing the whole or any part of the operations covered by the application, if it is found that the applicant is fit, willing, and able properly to perform the services proposed and conform to the provisions of this chapter and the requirements, rules and regulations of the commission thereunder, and that such operations will be consistent with the public interest, and, in the case of common carriers, that the same are or will be required by the present or future public convenience and necessity, otherwise such application shall be denied.
- (3) Nothing contained in this chapter shall be construed to confer upon any person or persons the exclusive right or privilege of transporting property for compensation over the public highways of the state.
- (4) A common carrier, contract carrier, or temporary carrier operating without the permit required in subsection (1) of this section, or who violates a cease and desist order of the commission issued under RCW 81.04.510, is subject to a penalty, under the process set forth in RCW 81.04.405, of one thousand five hundred dollars.
- (5) Notwithstanding RCW 81.04.510, the commission may, in conjunction with issuing the penalty set forth in subsection (4) of this section, issue cease and desist orders to carriers operating without the permit required in subsection (1) of this section, and to all persons involved in the carriers' operations.

Unlawful advertising — **Penalty.**

Any person not holding a permit authorizing him to operate as a common carrier, contract carrier, or temporary carrier for the transportation of property for compensation in this state, or an exempt carrier, who displays on any building, vehicle, billboard or in any manner, any

advertisement of, or by circular, letter, newspaper, magazine, poster, card or telephone directory, advertises the transportation of property for compensation shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable as such.

I. SYNOPSIS

This order approves a settlement agreement between the Commission Staff and petitioner Dan Busby d/b/a Careful Movers, Careful and Courteous Movers (Careful Movers or Applicant), and lifts the Commission's prior order that required Careful Movers to cease and desist operating as a households goods carrier without a permit.

II. PROCEDURAL HISTORY

- On February 8, 2000, the Commission issued two penalty assessments against Careful Movers. In Penalty Assessment No. 99781, the Commission assessed a penalty totaling \$1500 for three violations relating to advertising as a public service company without holding a permit to operate as such. In Penalty Assessment No. 10034, the Commission assessed a penalty totaling \$1500 for operating as a common carrier of household goods without a permit to do so. The Commission simultaneously ordered Careful Movers to cease and desist from operating as a household goods carrier in the state of Washington.
- Pursuant to RCW 81.80.510, Careful Movers applied for a mitigation of the penalties assessed by the Commission. The Commission assigned the matter Docket No. TV-000418 and set it for a brief adjudicatory proceeding in accordance with WAC 480-09-500.
- On May 18, 2000, Careful Movers petitioned the Commission for a temporary household goods carrier permit, in Application Number P-78912.

- 5 The parties subsequently entered into settlement negotiations and eventually reached an agreement on July 31, 2000.
- 6 Careful Movers is represented by Kevin Keefe, attorney, Seattle. Commission Staff is represented by Jeff Goltz, AAG, Olympia.

III. DISCUSSION

- 7 The parties provide in the settlement agreement that the payment of penalties, the issuance of a permit for temporary authority, and the rescission of the Commission's order to cease and desist should be resolved as follows:
 - Careful Movers will pay to the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Public Service Revolving Fund) within 15 days of the order approving this settlement agreement a penalty of \$1500 in full settlement of both Penalty Assessment No. 100034 and No. 99781.
 - (2) The Commission will issue Careful Movers the temporary household goods carrier permit, requested in Permit No. P-78912, upon receipt of that penalty payment.
 - (3) Upon issuance of the temporary household goods carrier permit, the cease and desist order described above will be considered withdrawn.
 - (4) The Commission may enter the subjoined order.
- The Commission has the authority to approve a settlement agreements and "favors the voluntary settlement of disputes within its jurisdiction . . . when doing so is lawful and when the result is appropriate and consistent with the public interest in light of all the information available to the Commission." WAC 480-09-466.
- The Commission finds that the settlement agreement is appropriate and consistent with the public interest. The Commission will give effect to the agreement contingent on a finding that Careful Movers is fit, willing, and able to provide the proposed service. WAC 480-15-280. Therefore, the Commission approves and adopts the terms of the agreement.

¹ The Commission issues Careful Movers a temporary permit for authority as a household goods carrier in M.V. Order No. 149837 for a period of no more than 180 days.

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IV. FINDINGS OF FACT

- 10 1) On February 8, 2000, the Commission issued two penalty assessments against Careful Movers. In Penalty Assessment No. 99781, the Commission assessed a penalty totaling \$1500 for three violations relating to advertising as a public service company without holding a permit to operate as such. In Penalty Assessment No. 10034, the Commission assessed a penalty totaling \$1500 for operating as a common carrier of household goods without a permit to do so.
- On May 11, 2000, pursuant to WAC 480-09-500, the Commission determined that a brief adjudicative proceeding was appropriate to hear Careful Movers' petition to mitigate penalties.
- On May 18, 2000, Careful Movers petitioned the Commission for a temporary household goods carrier permit in Application Number P-78912.
- 4) The Commission Staff and Careful Movers entered a settlement, in which the Commission would grant to Careful Movers temporary authority to transport household goods. At such time, the Commission would withdraw its cease and desist order. In addition, Careful Movers would pay a reduced penalty of \$1500 within 15 days of the date of this Order.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission has jurisdiction over the parties to and subject matter of this proceeding.
- The Commission has the authority to approve settlement agreements pursuant to WAC 480-09-466.

VI. ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS That:

 The Commission approves and adopts the settlement agreement between the Commission Staff and Dan Busby d/b/a Careful Movers, Careful and Courteous Movers.

Background

On February 8, 2000, the Commission issued two penalty assessments against respondent Dan Busby d/b/a Careful Movers, Careful and Courteous Movers (Busby). In Penalty Assessment No. 99781, the Commission assessed a penalty totaling \$1500 for three violations relating to advertising as a public service company without holding a permit to operate as such company. In Penalty Assessment No. 100034, the Commission assessed a penalty totaling \$1500 for operating as a common carrier of household goods without a permit to do so in violation of 81.80.070(1). In conjunction with that penalty assessment, the Commission issued an order to Busby requiring him to cease and desist his operation as a common carrier of household goods.

Pursuant to RCW 81.04.510, Busby applied for mitigation of those penalties, requesting a hearing. The Commission assigned the matter Docket No. TV-000418 and set it for a brief adjudicatory proceeding pursuant to WAC 480-09-500 and subsequently reset that hearing for July 26, 2000.

On May 18, 2000, Busby applied to the Commission for a temporary household goods carrier permit. That permit application, number P78912, is pending.

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Settlement

The parties agree that this matter may be resolved as follows:

- Busby will pay to the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Public Service Revolving Fund) within 15 days of the order approving this settlement agreement a penalty of \$1500 in full settlement of the penalty assessments described above.
- The Commission will issue Busby the temporary household goods carrier permit, requested in permit application number P78912, upon receipt of that penalty payment.
- Upon issuance of that household good carrier permit, the cease and desist order described above will be considered withdrawn.
 - The Commission may enter the subjoined order.

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- Synopsis: This final order grants the request of W.W. Kassner, d/b/a Industrial
 Transfer, and T & T Milk Transport, Inc., to modify the initial order to dismiss the
 complaint against the carrier. In other respects, this order affirms the initial order. In
 doing so, it dismisses the Complaint and Order to Show Cause against fourteen
 household goods companies because they complied with reporting and fee requirements
 and dismisses the Complaint and Order to show cause against two companies that chose
 to voluntarily cancel their household goods carrier permits. In addition, this order
 cancels the household goods carrier permits of four household goods companies for failure
 to file an annual report as required by RCW 81.04.080, and failure to comply with
 reporting and fee requirements of WAC 480-15-480.
- Nature of the Proceeding: This is a proceeding in which the Commission ordered twenty-two household goods carriers to appear and show cause why their household goods permits should not be canceled for the carriers' failure to file annual reports or to pay regulatory fees.
- Procedural History: On November 29, 2005, the Commission entered a Complaint and Order to Show Cause Why Permit Should Not Be Canceled for Failure to Pay Regulatory Fees and/or Failure to File 2004 Annual Report; and Notice of Hearing against the listed respondents. The matter was heard upon due and proper notice by Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Theodora M. Mace on December 19, 2005, in Olympia, Washington. Within the time allowed for filing petitions for administrative review, Industrial Transfer Company petitioned for reinstatement of the Permit No. CC-1794, held in the name of W. W, Kassner, d/b/a Industrial Transfer Company, and T&T Milk Transport, Inc., holder of Permit No. HG-8685 petitioned for dismissal of the complaint against it. No other party petitioned for administrative review.

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- 4 Final Order: The Commission grants the request to reinstate CC-1794 of W.W. Kassner and HG-8685 of T & T Milk Transport, Inc. In all other respects, the Commission affirms and adopts the result of the initial order.
- Appearances: The Commission Staff is represented by Assistant Attorney
 General Jennifer Cameron-Rulkowski, Olympia, Washington. Specialty Moving
 is represented by David Wiley, attorney, Seattle, Washington. W. W. Kassner
 was represented by Ben E. Ives, for the estate of W. W. Kassner. T & T Milk
 Transport was represented by John O. Cooney, attorney, Spokane. No other
 respondent entered an appearance in this matter.

DISCUSSION

- Background. Public service companies, including household goods carriers, are required to file an annual report with the Commission. RCW 81.04.080. In addition, they are required to file with the Commission a statement showing gross operating revenue from intrastate operations for the preceding calendar year, and to pay a fee to the Commission based on gross operating revenue. WAC 480-15-480. The Commission sends annual report forms to the address on record with the Commission for each household goods carrier permit holder. Id. Each permit holder must submit an annual report and remit regulatory fees by May 1 of each year. Id.
- 7 The Commission sent annual report forms to each of the respondents of record in this proceeding. A search of Commission records indicated that respondents failed to comply with reporting and/or fee requirements of RCW 81.04.080 and WAC 480-15-480 by May 1, 2005.
- On November 29, 2005, the Commission served a complaint and order to show cause on respondents requiring them to appear before the Commission on December 19, 2005, to answer the complaint, and to show cause why their

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household goods carrier permits should not be canceled for failure to file an annual report as required by RCW 81.04.080, and failure to comply with reporting and fee requirements of WAC 480-15-480.

- Hearing. At the hearing on December 19, 2005, Commission Staff presented the testimony of Ms. Sheri Hoyt, Compliance Specialist with the Commission's Businesses Practices Investigation Section. Ms. Hoyt sponsored thirteen exhibits which were admitted in evidence. Ms. Hoyt testified that respondents Cascade Moving; Sunshine Movers; G.J. Daniels; LeMay; Hutson Moving; Lincoln Moving; Lindsey Excavating; Maskelyne Transfer; Metropolitan Movers; People Movers; William Sell; Specialty Moving; Swan's Moving; and, Washington Moving complied with RCW 81.04.080 and WAC 480-15-480 by filing their annual reports and/or remitting their regulatory fees prior to the Show Cause hearing. Tr. 7-13, 17-26, Exhibits 1-7; 9-14. Ms. Hoyt recommended that the Commission not cancel the permits of these companies because they are now in compliance with statutory and regulatory reporting and fee requirements. Id.
- Ms. Hoyt testified that, based on her investigation, the following companies did not file their 2004 Annual Reports or pay their 2005 regulatory fees: Careful Movers; Progressive Movers; Industrial Transfer; Maust; Pacific Northwest; Pozzi Brothers; and T&T Milk. Therefore, Ms. Hoyt recommended that the Commission cancel the permits of these companies. Tr. 12-20,
- Commission Staff moved to dismiss Cummings Moving from this proceeding because the company had filed a letter voluntarily cancelling its permit.
- Post-hearing Motion to Dismiss Pozzi Brothers. On December 30, 2005, Commission Staff filed a motion to dismiss Pozzi Brothers from this proceeding. Staff stated that on December 16, 2005, Pozzi Brothers had filed a request to remove its household goods authority from its common carrier permit. The

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Commission granted the request on December 19, 2005.¹ Staff stated that it did not become aware of the company's voluntary surrender of its household goods authority until December 29, 2005, ten days after the evidentiary proceeding in this case.

- Initial order. The administrative law judge entered an initial order on January 4, 2006, that proposed dismissing the complaint against specified carriers.
- Post-order pleadings. Within the time for seeking administrative review of initial orders, the estate of W. W. Kassner petitioned to reinstate the permit of W. W. Kassner, and T & T Milk Transport petitioned to reopen the record. Both petitions sought admission of information showing compliance with requirements of law and dismissal of the complaint against the identified carrier. Commission Staff answered the petitions, in each instance acknowledging compliance and supporting the requested remedy.
- Discussion and Conclusion. The Commission received no pleadings with regard to any respondent except Kassner and T & T. The initial order should be affirmed and adopted, with the exception of the proposed result for Kassner and T & T. Consistent with Commission practice in prior proceedings and with the public interest, the complaint should be dismissed against those carriers based on their compliance with law and regulation prior to the time for submission of the final pleading in this docket.
- The Commission may cancel a household goods carrier permit for good cause, including failure to submit an annual report or failure to pay regulatory fees. WAC 480-15-450. The unrebutted evidence presented by Commission Staff shows that Careful Movers; Progressive Movers; Maust; and Pacific Northwest violated Washington State law, and the Commission's rules and that they remain out of compliance despite the opportunity in this docket to remedy their

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noncompliance. Therefore, the household goods permits of these companies should be cancelled.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 17 (1) The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission is an agency of the state of Washington, vested by statute with authority to regulate public service companies, including companies that hold authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation.
- 18 (2) Each of the respondents of record in this proceeding is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010 and holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation.
- 19 (3) The Commission sent annual report forms and instructions to the address on record with the Commission for each of the named respondents.
- 20 (4) A search of Commission records indicated that respondents failed to comply with reporting and/or fee requirements of RCW 81.04.080 and WAC 480-15-480 by May 1, 2005.
- 21 (5) On November 29, 2005, the Commission entered a Complaint and Order to Show Cause ordering each respondent to appear and show cause why its permit should not be canceled.
- During a Show Cause hearing on December 19, 2005, Commission Staff testified that respondents Cascade Moving; Sunshine Movers; G.J. Daniels; LeMay; Hutson Moving; Lincoln Moving; Lindsey Excavating; Maskelyne Transfer; Metropolitan Movers; People Movers; William Sell; Specialty Moving; Swan's Moving; and, Washington Moving filed their annual reports and/or remitted their regulatory fees prior to the hearing.

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- 23 (7) Staff testified that Cummings Moving filed a request for voluntary cancellation of its permit.
- On December 30, 2005, Staff filed a motion to dismiss Pozzi Brothers from this proceeding because the Commission had granted the company's request to remove household goods authority from its common carrier permit.
- 25 (9) Careful Movers; Progressive Movers; W. W. Kassner; Maust; Pacific Northwest; and T&T Milk failed to appear at the hearing on December 19, 2005, and show cause why their permits should not be canceled. Subsequently, W. W. Kassner and T & T Milk petitioned for relief from the result proposed in the initial order.
- 26 (10) The files and records of the Commission show that Careful Movers; Progressive Movers; Maust; and Pacific Northwest failed to file their annual reports for 2004 or remit regulatory fees for 2005 in compliance with RCW 81.04.080 and WAC 480-15-480.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 27 (1) The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this proceeding and all parties to this proceeding.
- 28 (2) The Complaint and Order to Show Cause directed to Cascade Moving; Cummings Moving; Sunshine Movers; G.J. Daniels; LeMay; Hutson Moving; Lincoln Moving; Lindsey Excavating; Maskelyne Transfer; Metropolitan Movers; People Movers; Pozzi Brothers; William Sell; Specialty Moving; Swan's Moving; W. W. Kassner d/b/a Industrial

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Transport, T & T Milk Transport, and Washington Moving should be dismissed.

29 (3) Good cause exists under WAC 480-15-450 to cancel the household goods carrier permits of Careful Movers; Progressive Movers; Maust; and Pacific Northwest.

ORDER

- IT IS HEREBY ORDERED That Cascade Moving; Cummings Moving; Sunshine Movers; G.J. Dear Mr. Busby:

The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (commission) cancelled your household goods permit, HG-11879, on February 9, 2006, for failure to file a 2004 annual report and pay the 2005 regulatory fee (see enclosed).

To provide a clear explanation of what this means, you are no longer permitted to haul household goods or general commodities for hire in the state of Washington. You must stop operating immediately.

Companies providing for-hire transportation of household goods in Washington State must have a household goods (HG) permit issued by the commission. The HG permit, in addition to providing the authority to haul household goods, allows a carrier to haul general commodities within the state. A company providing only general commodities transportation for-hire must have a common carrier or CC permit issued by the commission.

If we find that you are providing for-hire household goods or general commodities transportation without the proper permit(s), you are subject to penalties of up to \$1,000 per day. In addition, the commission can subpoen you for a formal classification proceeding.

To resume household goods or common carrier transportation, you must submit an application and receive a permit prior to operating. You may obtain an application online at www.wutc.wa.gov or contact our Licensing Services office at 360-664-1222 and request an application packet.

"I hired Careful Movers for a move, which its movers failed to complete due to incompetence. After six months of negotiations, Careful Movers offered a partial refund, has failed to produce send the refund (alleging it is lost in the mail), and has now advised me to "sue them" or accept a check for a reduced amount. The details follow.

I hired Careful Mover to move me on December 23, 2006. When we arrived at my new building, the movers said my three bookshelves would not fit through the elevator, stairwells, or windows. The shelves dimensions are 84 X 24 X 12.5 inches (two shelves) and 90 X 40 X16.5 inches (one shelf). The movers did not try to physically move the shelves when we arrived at the new building. Instead, we moved the shelves back to my storage unit in the old building.

After a friend assessed the shelves dimensions and options for moving them into the building, I was convinced it could be done. I called Careful Movers and spoke with Shane. I asked him to send a truck and two different movers to move the shelves at no additional charge. I was so confident that I offered to pay the hourly rate if I was incorrect and the shelves would not fit. Shane declined my request.

On March 30th, I borrowed a friend's truck and hired two laborers to move the shelves. We successfully moved all three shelves into the new building; the two seven foot tall shelves fit into the elevator, and the seven and a half foot tall shelf fit through one of the stairwells.

I requested in writing a refund from Careful Movers for the quantifiable costs to complete the work Careful Movers did not:

\$200 laborers from Craig's List

\$75 three month storage fees at the former apartment

Total \$275

*note I did not even ask for the \$85 per hour to move the shelves to storage when the movers failed to get them into the building.

I called Careful Movers several times a week for nearly two months before it agreed to send me a refund on May 24th. Someone from Careful Movers always answers the phone and will take a message, When I did not receive the refund check after a month, I called Careful Movers again. It claims it mailed me a check, but I have not received it. After several weeks of calling, Careful Movers told me this morning it will issue me a new check minus \$30, the cost of canceling the previous check. Careful Movers told me if I was still dissatisfied, I could "sue them".

Needless to say, this issue does not meet the criteria for small claims court, and I am certain Careful Movers know this. I have made every effort to work with this company. At best, Careful Movers is extremely unprofessional, but I think the owner is simply a crook.

Dan Busby, the owner, has never returned any of my phone calls. I speak with people who work in the office several times a week, but they claim all they can do is take messages. I have sent him a complaint in writing.

I would like a \$275 (not \$245) refund check sent by certified mail to my address: 417 E. Pine Street #209 Seattle, WA 98122

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CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF UNIFORM HOUSEHOLD GOODS BILL OF LADING

The following terms and conditions apply to all services performed by the carrier under this contract. This contract is also subject to all rules, rates, and charges in the current tariff published by, or on file with, the Washington Utilities and

SECTION 1.
(A) THE CARRIER IS LIABLE for physical loss of, or damage to, any article from external cause while being packed, unpacked, loaded, unloaded, carried or held in storage-in-transit, including breakage, if articles are packed by the carrier and/or if the breakage results from negligence of the carrier. The carrier's liability is subject to the limitations of liability

THE CARRIER IS NOT LIABLE for loss of, or damage to, any article from external cause while being carried or held in storage-in-transit, for the following circumstances:

Breakage, when articles are packed by the customer or the customer's representative unless it can be proven that the

breakage resulted from negligence by the carrier in handling the article(s).

Change in the condition or flavor of perishable articles.

Loss or damage to documents, bank bills, notes, currency, money, postage stamps, letters, or valuable papers of any

kind.

(4) Loss or damage to jewelry, watches, precious stones, or precious metals.

(5) An act, omission, or order of the customer, or loss or damage (egoliting from the customer's inclusion in the shipment such articles as explosives, dangerous articles or dangerous goods.

(6) Defective design of an article, including susceptibility logarnage because of atmospheric conditions such as temperature and humidity changes.

(7) Hostile or warlike action or use of any weapon of war (in time of peace or war); terrorism; insurrection; rebellion; revolution; civil war, usurped power, and editoriaken in hindering, combating or defending against such occurrences:

(a) by any government or sovereign power, or by authority maintaining or using military forces; or (b) by military forces; or (c) by an agent of any such government, power, authority or forces.

(8) Seizure, confiscation, or destruction under quarantine by order of any government or public authority.

(9) Strikes, lockouts, labor disturbances, riots, civil commotions or the acts of any person or persons taking part in any such occurrence or disorder.

(10) Acts of God.

SECTION 2. The carrier's maximum liability shall be determined based on the valuation option selected by the customer on the ace of this contract.

(A) If the customer selected Basic Value Protection, the carrier's maximum liability shall be the actual loss or damage not exceeding \$.60 per pound of weight of any lost or damaged article(s).

(B) If the customer selected Depreciated Value Protection, the carrier's maximum liability shall be the amount of the actual loss or damage not exceeding \$2.00 times the actual weight (in pounds) of the shipment.

(C) If the customer selected Replacement Cost Coverage with a deductible, the carrier's maximum liability shall be the amount of the actual loss or damage less a \$300 deductible not exceeding \$3.50 times the weight of the shipment, or the lump sum declared value, whichever is greater.

(D) If the customer selected Replacement Cost Coverage, the carrier's maximum liability shall be the amount of the actual loss or damage not exceeding \$3.50 times the weight of the shipment, or the lump sum declared value, whichever is oreater.

SECTION 3. Unless specific arrangements have been authorized by this contract, the carrier is not required to transport the customer's goods by any particular schedule, means, or vehicle and is not liable for delays resulting from causes other than negligence of the carrier. Further, in case of unforseen circumstances which prevent the carrier from completing delivery, the carrier has the right to forward the customer's property by another carrier.

SECTION 4. The customer must pay all legal charges. If the carrier is required to refer this contract to an attorney for collection of charges due, shipper agrees to pay reasonable attorney fees and collections costs. If this contract is referred to court for resolution, the non-prevailing party shall be responsible for payment of reasonable attorney fees and court costs.

The carrier may place a shipment into storage at the public warehouse nearest the point of destination if the carrier is unable to make delivery because:

(1) The carrier was unable to locate a customer at the address given or the correct address;

The customer refused or was unable to accept delivery; or

On a shipment moving under a non-binding estimate, the customer was unable or refused to pay up to 110 percent of

Complaint: Basically Ms. wanted Careful Movers to pay for the secondary moving efforts by a different mover because Careful Movers should have moved the bookcases on the initial move.

Investigation Findings: Nonjurisdictional. UTC has no jurisdiction over a customer incurring additional expenses and then wanting the mover to reimburse for what was not accomplished at the time of the move.

During the course of the investigation, it was found that Careful Movers was operating without a valid UTC permit.

Summary: Valid proof of the company operating without a permit was secured in the form of a cancelled check [front and back] from the customer. Because this complaint was deemed nonjurisdiction by staff, no assessment of RCW or WAC violations are noted.

All documents provided were scanned and can be found in the complaint electronic file.

UTC Business Practices Section and Transportation Section were made aware of the company operating without a permit on August 9, 2007. Further action may be followed after staff review within these sections.

I, Colleen L. Kelly hereby declare:

I am over the age of 18, am competent to testify on the matters set forth below and have personal knowledge of those matters.

I hired Careful Movers for a move, which its movers failed to complete due to incompetence. After six months of negotiations, Careful Movers offered a partial refund, failed to produce the refund (alleging it is lost in the mail), and then advised me to "sue them" or accept a check for a reduced amount. The details follow.

I hired Careful Mover to move me from 12508 Lake City Way NE, #517, Seattle, WA 98125 on December 23, 2006. When we arrived at my new building at 417 E. Pine Street, #209, Seattle, WA 98122, the movers said my three bookshelves would not fit through the elevator, stairwells, or windows. The shelves dimensions are 84 X 24 X 12.5 inches (two shelves) and 90 X 40 X16.5 inches (one shelf). The movers did not try to physically move the shelves when we arrived at the new building. Instead, we moved the shelves back to my storage unit in the old building.

After a friend assessed the shelves dimensions and options for moving them into the building, I was convinced it could be done. I called Careful Movers and spoke with Shane. I asked him to send a truck and two different movers to move the shelves at no additional charge. I was so confident that I offered to pay the hourly rate if I was incorrect and the shelves would not fit. Shane declined my request.

On March 30th, I borrowed a friend's truck and hired two laborers to move the shelves. We successfully moved all three shelves into the new building; the two seven foot tall shelves fit into the elevator, and the seven and a half foot tall shelf fit through one of the stairwells.

I requested in writing a refund from Careful Movers for the quantifiable costs to complete the work Careful Movers did not. I called Careful Movers several times a week for nearly two months before it agreed to send me a refund on May 24th. Someone from Careful Movers always answers the phone and will take a message. When I did not receive the refund check after a month, I called Careful Movers again. It claims it mailed me a check, but I had not received it. After several weeks of calling, Careful Movers told me it would issue me a new check minus \$30, the cost of canceling the previous check. Careful Movers told me if I was still dissatisfied, I could "sue them". I picked up the \$245 refund check on July 7, 2007.
