Pierce County Refuse has filed a request with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission to increase garbage and recycling rates effective March 1, 2008. This increase is to cover increased operating costs, including disposal fees, fuel, equipment, labor and medical insurance. Our last increase took effect March 1, 2007. Current and proposed rates are as follows:
