To whom it may concern:

The Northwest Railway Museum is located in Snoqualmie, and receives over 85,000 visitors per year: It is leading cultural attraction for the Snoqualmie Valley, East King County and the State of Washington.

On January 7 & 8, 2009, the Museum experienced the worst flood impact in its 52 year history. At the crest, nearly half of the Museum's railroad and two bridges were underwater with the Snoqualmie Depot escaping the water by less than three inches. However with the rapid rise of the water in the hours leading up to the food crest, it seemed plausible that the Museum's Snoqualmie Depot would actually be flooded. In an attempt to mitigate almost certain disaster, all paper records located within 18 inches of the building floor were hastily gathered up, thrown into boxes, and stacked on tables. This created a disaster of sorts because many files were mixed up, and six months later are still not fully sorted. The Museum had hoped this would be its greatest challenge. However that was not to be.

When the water receded, there were multiple track washouts extending over a distance of 2.2 miles. Damage was valued at well over \$100,000. The Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Small Business Administration deemed the museum ineligible to receive a disaster recovery grant because they believed the Museum to be financially robust enough to borrow the money and service a mortgage. The Museum does not agree with that assessment but has little choice and, in a contracting economy where many of the museum's patrons have not been able to make a contribution this year, this has had a devastating impact. So the Museum agreed to accept a loan from the Small Business Administration, completed track repairs, repaired damaged railroad crossing signals and brought them back into regulatory compliance, but in doing all this has not been able to afford any additional staff or administrative support, especially considering the SBA has yet to disburse all the money they approved and we have actually spent. The Museum continues to be burdened by the impact of this flood and while putting on a brave face to the public, is struggling to maintain regular programs and commitments.

The direct impact of the flood was nearly three months of full time crisis management. The letter you advise was sent in March cannot be found, which we realize in of itself does not relieve our responsibility to file a report. Regardless, we have many obligations we are having great difficulty in meeting but are pleased to report that safety compliance remains our top priority and we hope you agree that is our best course.
