BACKGROUND

- Household goods carriers operating in the state of Washington and subject to regulation by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) must file and maintain proof of liability and property damage insurance. RCW 81.80; WAC 480-15.
- On July 11, 2011, the Commission notified U Save Moving, Inc., by letter that the Commission would suspend U Save Moving, Inc.'s permit to operate as a household goods carrier in Washington State if U Save Moving, Inc., did not file acceptable proof of insurance by the insurance cancellation date. The Commission also informed U Save Moving, Inc., that it could contest suspension of its permit by requesting a hearing within 10 days of the notice. The Commission did not receive proof of insurance and U Save Moving, Inc., did not request a hearing.
- The Commission subsequently suspended U Save Moving, Inc.'s permit for a period of 30 days effective August 12, 2011. In the suspension order, the Commission informed U Save Moving, Inc., that it would cancel its permit if U Save Moving, Inc. did not file acceptable proof of insurance within the 30-day suspension period. The Commission also notified U Save Moving, Inc., it could contest cancellation of the permit by requesting a hearing within 10 days of service of the suspension order. The Commission has not received proof of insurance and U Save Moving, Inc. has not requested a hearing.

DECISION

U Save Moving, Inc., has failed to maintain acceptable proof of liability and property damage insurance as required by applicable law. Accordingly, the Commission should cancel U Save Moving, Inc.'s permit to operate as a household goods carrier in Washington State.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

- The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission is an agency of the state of Washington having authority to regulate household goods carriers as defined in RCW 81.80.
- U Save Moving, Inc., is a household goods carrier operating in Washington state under permit THG-64131.
- On July 11, 2011, the Commission received notice that U Save Moving, Inc.'s insurance would be cancelled effective August 12, 2011.
- 8 (4) The Commission suspended U Save Moving, Inc., effective August 12, 2011, for failure to maintain proof of liability and property damage insurance.
- 9 (5) The Commission is authorized under WAC 480-15-430(1)(b) to suspend a household goods permit for failure to file and maintain proof of insurance.
- 10 (6) The Commission is authorized under WAC 480-15-150(1)(b) to cancel a household goods permit for failure to correct conditions leading to suspension within the time defined in the suspension order.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 11 (1) The household goods permit and provisional operating authority THG-64131, held by U Save Moving, Inc., is cancelled.
- U Save Moving, Inc., must immediately cease all operations associated with permit THG-64131.
- U Save Moving, Inc., is no longer authorized to operate as a household goods carrier under this operating authority.

- 14 (4) The application for permanent household goods authority in Docket TV-102031 is dismissed.
- U Save Moving, Inc., may contest cancellation of permit THG-64131 by requesting a hearing within 10 days of service of this Order.
- The Commission has delegated authority to the Secretary to enter this Order under RCW 80.01.030, WAC 480-07-905(1)(h).

NOTICE: This is an order delegated to the Secretary, or the Secretary's delegate, for decision. In addition to serving you a copy of the decision, the Commission will post on its Internet Web site for at least 14 days a listing of all matters delegated to the Secretary for decision. You may seek Commission review of this decision. You must file a request for Commission review of this order no later than fourteen (14) days after the date the decision is posted on the Commission's Web site.

The Commission will schedule your request for review by issuing a notice of hearing to be held before an administrative law judge. The Commission, at its discretion, may consider your request for review in an adjudicative proceeding under RCW 34.05 Part IV, or in a brief adjudicative proceeding under RCW 34.05.482 through .494. Following hearing, the administrative law judge will enter an initial order. If you wish to seek review of the initial order, you may file a petition for administrative review under RCW 34.05.464, or if the matter is heard in a brief adjudicative proceeding, under RCW 34.05.491.

The Commission will grant a late-filed request for review only on a showing of good cause, including a satisfactory explanation of why the person did not timely file the request. A form for late-filed requests is available on the Commission's Web site.

This notice and review process is pursuant to the provisions of RCW 80.01.030 and WAC 480-07-905, as amended effective September 22, 2008.
