Re: Rulemaking to Consider Modifications to, or Elimination of, the Requirement Related to Distribution of Telephone Books in WAC 480-120-251 Docket UT-120451

TO ALLANTERESTED PERSONS

On April 18, 2012, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) filed with the Code Reviser a Preproposal Statement of Inquiry (CR-101) to consider modifications to, or elimination of, the requirement that local exchange companies provide each customer a copy of a telephone directory for the customer's exchange area, as described in WAC 480-120-251. The Commission filed the CR-101 under Docket UT-120451.

Due to changes in technology, the number of people who rely on printed directories of telephone numbers has decreased significantly and continues to decline. Telephone numbers are readily available on the Internet, which an increasing number of consumers access in place of printed directories. Communities are also concerned with the environmental impact of printed directories, and local governments are beginning to encourage their citizens to forgo these directories as a means of reducing waste and the expense created by directory disposal. This rulemaking seeks to accommodate these concerns and customer usage patterns to more carefully tailor regulatory requirements to consumer and community needs.

Interested persons are asked to comment on whether the Commission should eliminate or modify the current requirement that telecommunications companies provide printed directories. Comments that respond to the following questions would be most useful:

1. Do all telephone company customers need printed directories of telephone numbers? If not, which types of customers continue to need such directories?
