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IX. Comments

On April 30, 2016 at 14:15 an Amtrak train was traveling south through the South Lander Street crossing when it struck a vehicle.

This is a four lane road that crosses four railroad tracks. The crossing is equipped with active warning devices including gates, pedestrian gates, bells, and lights which were activated at the time of the incident.

According to the police report, witnesses stated there was a slow moving freight train making switching moves across the crossing for several minutes. Once the frieght train started to clear the crossing the witnesses observed a southbound passenger train headed towards the crossing. The passenger train was sounding it horn as it entered the crossing on one of the west tracks. When the train entered the crossing witnesses stated they heard a loud crash and saw debris fly into the air. According to witness statements, Mr. Walker passed behind the slow moving freight train travelling northbound on track main track three. As Mr. Walker crossed main track two, he was struck by a southbound passenger train traveling at 30 miles per hour.

The Certificate of Death listed the cause of death as "Mutiple Blunt Force Injuries" and "Manner of Death" as "Accident".
