Attached please find revised pages for Tariff Number 9.3, as well as supporting documentation for the commodity credit adjustment. Tariff pages 1, 23, 25, 28 and 29 are affected by this change.

In area RSA-1 the residential and multi-family credit will decrease from \$1.59 to a debit of \$1.63, a decrease of \$3.22 (203%) per customer, per month. In Thurston County Below 142nd the residential credit will decrease from \$1.70 to a debit of \$1.66, a decrease of \$3.36 (198%) per customer, per month. The multi-family credit will decrease from \$1.72 to a debit of \$1.67, a decrease of \$3.39 (197%) per customer, per month.

Due to the implications of China's National Sword, commodity prices declined from \$63/ton to (\$51)/ton during this commodity credit test period. Due to the volatility in the recycling commodity markets we are hereby requesting a waiver from WAC 480-70-351(2). The calculation uses the most recent six-month historical period to estimate the recycling commodity revenue/commodity credit for the next six months.

If approved by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, the revised commodity credit will go into effect on July1, 2018. Pursuant to WAC 480-70-271(2)(a)(vi), affected customers will receive notification of this change on the billing reflecting the revised rates.
