Starlink Services, LLC ("Starlink") hereby withdraws its letter to the Commission dated July 29, 2022 in the above-referenced docket asking the Commission to certify Starlink as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier ("ETC") for receipt of federal high-cost funds pursuant to section 54.314 of the Federal Communications Commission's ("FCC") rules. Starlink has not yet been authorized to receive Rural Digital Opportunity Fund ("RDOF") high-cost Universal Service Fund support, and did not receive any support in 2021. The FCC waived on its own motion the general high-cost support program requirement that state commissions file a section 54.314 certification by October 1, 2022 with respect to RDOF support recipients that "did not receive Auction 904 support in 2021 and will not file an annual report with respect to those supported areas on July 1, 2022." Moreover, WAC 480-123-070 and 080, which require ETC's that received federal high-cost fund to certify and provide various reports, are not relevant here because Starlink is not yet receiving federal high-cost support. Therefore, Starlink's July 29, 2002 letter requesting certification was not necessary and is withdrawn.
