RE: Grade Crossing Protective Fund – Outstanding Applications

Dear Mr. Jungmann:

In 2022, CWW LLC filed Grade Crossing Protective Fund (GCPF) petitions with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (UTC), seeking funding to upgrade active warning devices at nine highway-rail grade crossings in the Walla Walla area:

Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) owns the rail lines involved and its signature consenting to each petition is required. UTC staff is aware that you have been working with UPRR to obtain the required signatures but have so far been unsuccessful.

GCPF projects must be completed and reimbursement documents must be submitted to the UTC within the same state budget biennium in which they are evaluated and awarded. The end of the current

biennium is rapidly approaching (June 30, 2023), and it is unlikely that these projects could be approved for funding and completed by that deadline. Because of this, CWW LLC will need to re-apply for funding during the next GCPF funding cycle.

UTC staff is in the process of revising the petition and application forms to better accommodate proposed projects such as these where the rail line is owned by an entity other than the applicant. We will send out notice once the new funding cycle begins (around July 1). At that time, CWW LLC will need to resubmit applications for each of the proposed projects using the updated petition forms. These will be available on the UTC website at Grade Crossing Protective Fund (wa.gov)
