The purpose of this filing is to implement changes to rates under the established Energy Charge Credit Recovery Adjustment Schedule 141A, as provided for in the Commission’s Final Order 24/10 (“Order”) in Dockets UE-220066, UG-220067, and UG-10918 (consolidated) (“2022 GRC Dockets”)<sup>1</sup>. This filing reflects an increase in the revenue requirements due to a 2% annual Energy Charge Credit increase for Schedule 139 Voluntary Long Term Renewable Energy Purchase Rider (“Schedule 139”), as approved in the Order, from \$35.3 million set in 2023 to \$36.0 million in 2024. Additionally, it includes a January 2023 through August 2023 true-up for the overcollections on Schedule 141A, where revenues collected during this period have been

compared to Energy Charge Credits issued under Schedule 139 for \$1.5M. The proposed rates will be effective January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024.

The impact of this filing is an overall decrease of \$2.0 million, or 0.08 percent. The typical residential customer using 800 kWh per month would experience a decrease to their monthly bill of \$0.07 or 0.07 percent.

The tariff sheets described herein reflect an issue date of October 6, 2023, and an effective date of January 1, 2024. Posting of proposed tariff changes, as required by law and the Commission's rules and regulations, is being completed through web, telephone and mail access in accordance with WAC 480-100-193. Notice to the public under the provisions of WAC 480-100-194 will be provided within 30 days of the January 1, 2024, effective date.
