Re: TV-220178- Reinstating Temporary Household Goods Permit - THG069175

Dear Dubonosov, Artur:

On March 18, 2022, Dubonosov, Artur, d/b/a Piano Moving Art, filed an application with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) to reinstate its permit to provide residential household goods transportation services in the state of Washington. You have met the initial application requirements by attending Household Goods orientation on April 15, 2020.

The Commission grants Dubonosov, Artur's request to reinstate permit THG069175 for household goods carrier authority and approves the application in full. Permit THG069175 issued in the name of Dubonosov, Artur is enclosed, and the company may operate on a temporary basis.

The Commission will continue to evaluate whether Dubonosov, Artur qualifies for permanent authority. To qualify for permanent authority, your company must satisfy the following requirements:

- 1. Personnel responsible for company management and operations **must** attend the one-day Commission-sponsored training class to learn about consumer protection rules, safety regulations and industry-wide tariff provisions that apply to your business. Contact householdgoods@utc.wa.gov to sign up for virtual training. Failure to complete the training will result in denial of your permanent authority.
- 2. Operate for at least six months.
- 3. Allow the Commission to review your business operations and records. Commission staff will review records and inspect vehicle(s), and you must receive a satisfactory safety rating as a result of that review.

- 4. Complete a criminal background check on each person Dubonosov, Artur employs or intends to employ. The Commission will not grant permanent authority if any company employee has been convicted of any crime within the past five years involving theft, burglary, assault, sexual misconduct, identity theft, fraud, false statements, or the manufacture, sale, or distribution of a controlled substance. Even if a conviction for any of these offenses is more than five years old, the Commission will not grant permanent authority if it determines that the nature or extent of the crime(s) will likely interfere with the proper operation of a household goods moving company.
- 5. Pay any outstanding monetary penalty or fee owed to the Commission.
- 6. Resolve all consumer complaints pending with the Commission.

Dubonosov, Artur must continue to comply with state laws, Commission rules, and the provisions of Tariff 15-C. Failure to do so will result in Commission enforcement action, up to and including revocation of the company's permit.
