On September 11, 2006, the Commission conducted a prehearing conference in Olympia, Washington before Administrative Law judge Dennis J. Moss. Persons who can demonstrate a substantial interest in the proceeding, or who can demonstrate that their participation would be in the public interest may file a petition to intervene as described in WAC 480-07-355. Persons granted status as Intervenors both acquire rights and assume obligations. Intervenors are expected to participate actively in the proceeding.

Petitions to intervene must be directed to the Executive Director at the above address for filing in accordance with WAC 480-07-145 and must be served on all parties in accordance with WAC 480-07-150.

THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that interested persons are invited to indicate their wish to be included on the list of persons who will receive direct service of all Commission orders and notices relating to the above-named dockets by letter request directed to the Commission's Executive Secretary at the address provided above.

THE COMMISSION ALSO GIVES NOTICE that the period of time during which any person who has a substantial interest in this proceeding or whose participation would be in the public interest may file a timely petition to intervene in accordance with the requirements of WAC 480-07-355 is extended to September 22, 2006.
