

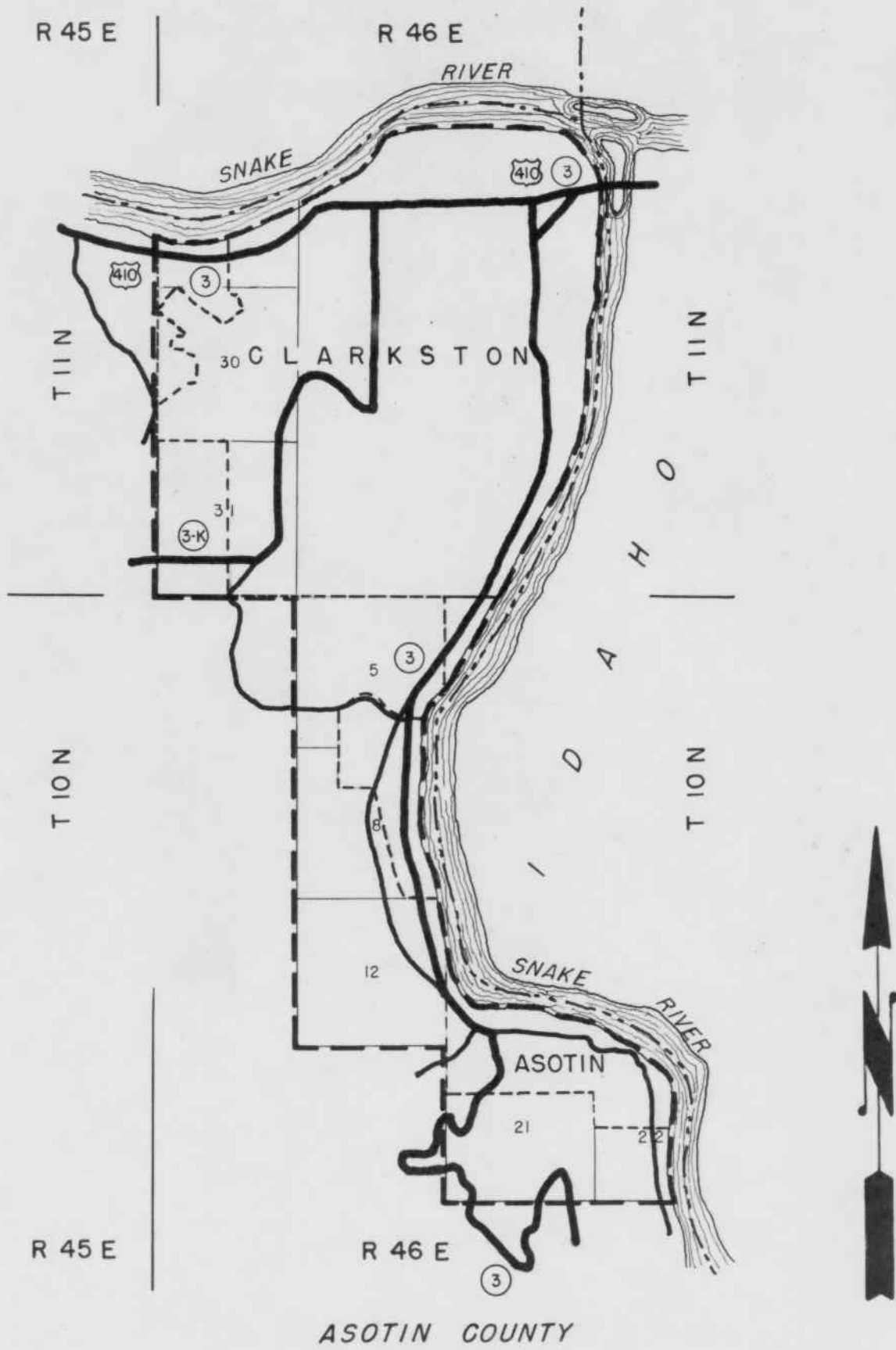

ASOTIN AND VICINITY--ASOTIN COUNTY

All of the incorporated area comprising the City of Clarkston and additional portions of Asotin County adjacent thereto lying within the area described as follows:









Beginning at a point in the center of the Snake River due east of the south line of section 22, T. 10 N., R. 46 E. W. M., thence west along the south line of sections 22 and 21 to the southwest corner of section 21, thence north along the west line of section 21 to the northwest corner of section 21, thence west along the south line of section 17 to the southwest corner of section 17, thence north along the west line of sections 17, 8 and 5 to the northwest corner of section 5, thence west along the south line of section 31, T. 11 N., R. 46 E. W. M. to the southwest corner of section 31, thence north along the west line of sections 31, 30 and 19 to the center line of the Snake River, thence along the center line of the Snake River in an easterly direction to a point where the Snake River intersects with the Clearwater River, thence southerly and westerly along the center line of the Snake River to the point of beginning.

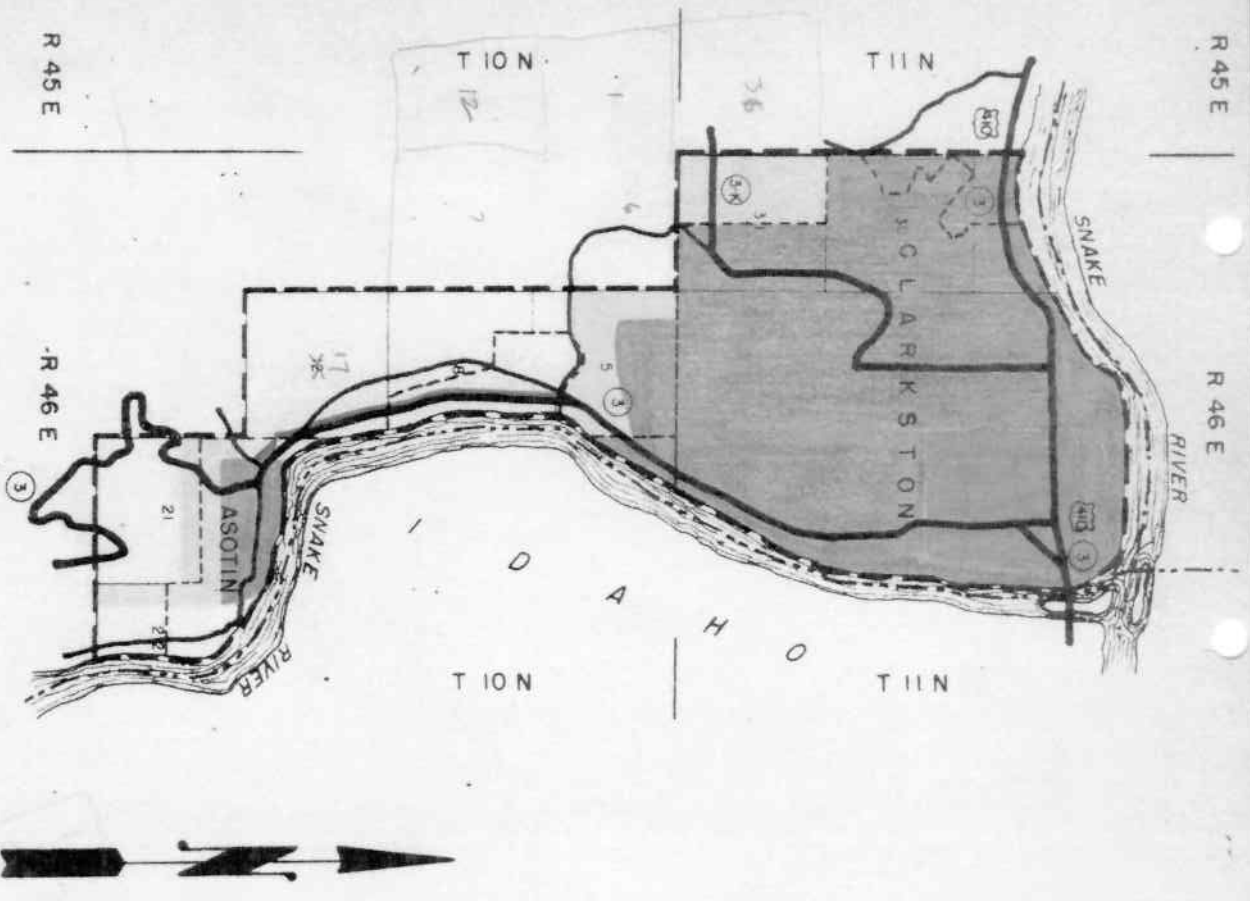

FINDINGS AND ORDER AFTER STATUTORY HEARING ISSUING
CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY

(Issued April 11, 1968)

On July 10, 1967, El Paso Natural Gas Company (Applicant), filed in Docket No. CP68-12 an application pursuant to Section 7(c) of the Natural Gas Act for a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the transportation and sale of natural gas in interstate commerce to The Washington Water Power Company (Water Power) for transportation to and resale and general distribution in the community of Asotin, Washington and environs, all as more fully set forth in the application.

Applicant requests authorization to sell and deliver natural gas to Water Power at the outlet of Applicant's existing Lewiston-Clarkston Meter Station in Lewiston, Idaho. Water Power will transport the natural gas to points of resale and distribution in the community of Asotin, Washington, through 4.9 miles of 4-1/2-inch transmission line extending from a point near Asotin to a point of connection on its existing system near Clarkston, Washington, to be constructed by Water Power at a cost of \$201,985. Applicant states that no additional facilities need be constructed by it.

The total third year peak day and annual requirements of the proposed new service are 154 Mcf and 12,757 Mcf, respectively.

The sale and delivery of gas to Water Power will be made in accordance with El Paso's filed FPC Rate Schedule DL-1.

Due notice of the application has been given by publication in the Federal Register on July 26, 1967 (32 FR 10952). No protest, petition to intervene, or notice of intervention has been filed in this proceeding concerning this application.

At a hearing held on April 4, 1968, the Commission on its own motion received and made a part of the record in this proceeding all evidence, including the application and exhibits submitted in support of the authorization sought, and upon consideration of the record,

The Commission finds:

(1) Applicant, El Paso Natural Gas Company, a Delaware corporation having its principal place of business in El Paso, Texas, is a "natural-gas company" within the meaning of the Natural Gas Act as heretofore found by the Commission in its order of October 29, 1942, in Docket Nos. G-242 and G-257 (3 FPC 851).

(2) The proposed operation of facilities by Applicant as hereinbefore described, and as more fully described in the application and exhibits in this proceeding will be used in the transportation and sale of natural gas in interstate commerce subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission and is subject to the requirements of Subsections (c) and (e) of Section 7 of the Natural Gas Act.

(3) The aforesaid proposed operation of facilities and sale of natural gas are required by the public convenience and necessity and a certificate therefor should be issued as hereinafter ordered and conditioned.

(4) Applicant is able and willing properly to do the acts and to perform the services proposed and to conform to the provisions of the Natural Gas Act, and the requirements, rules and regulations of the Commission thereunder.

(5) Public convenience and necessity require that the certificate issued hereinafter and the rights granted thereunder be conditioned upon Applicant's compliance with all applicable Commission Regulations under the Natural Gas Act and particularly the general terms and conditions set forth in paragraphs (a), (c)(3), (e), (f) and (g) of Section 157.20 of such Regulations.

The Commission orders:

(A) A certificate of public convenience and necessity is issued to the Applicant, El Paso Natural Gas Company in this proceeding authorizing the operation of facilities and sale of natural gas as hereinbefore described and as more fully described in the application and exhibits herein, subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission, upon the terms and conditions of this order.

(B) The certificate issued by paragraph (A) above and the rights granted thereunder are conditioned upon Applicant's compliance with all applicable Commission Regulations under the Natural Gas Act and particularly the general terms and conditions set forth in paragraphs (a), (c)(3), (e), (f) and (g) of such Regulations.

(C) The service authorized shall be commenced, as provided by paragraph (b) of Section 157.20 of the aforesaid Regulations within 12 months from the date on which this order issues.

(D) Applicant shall make an appropriate tariff filing with the Commission in accordance with the Commission's Rules and Regulations reflecting the service authorized herein.
