On December 11, 1998, the Commission issued its FINAL ORDER REGARDING USWC'S ALTERNATIVE REGULATION PLAN, PURSUANT TO MINN. STAT. § 237.764, SUBD. 2 in the above-entitled matter. In that Order, the Commission set forth language with which to modify the alternative regulation plan proposed by US WEST Communications, Inc. (USWC). Specifically, on page 11 the Commission discussed the need to modify the following language:

USWC agrees to be bound by the provisions in this section in any pending or future proceeding initiated after the effective date of this plan under Minn. Stat. § 237.081 concerning allegations that USWC has harmed the interest of a competitor by violating Minn. Stat. § 237.09 or § 237.121.

After explaining its intent to omit the words "pending or future," the Commission adopted the language as follows:

VIII. Competitive Enforcement. <u>USWC</u> agrees to be bound by the provisions in this section in any proceeding initiated after the effective date of this plan under Minn. Stat. § 237.081 concerning allegations that USWC has harmed the interest of a competitor by violating Minn. Stat. § 237.07 or § 237.121.

December 11 Order at 11, 17. In doing so, the Commission inadvertently changed a statutory reference from Minn. Stat. § 237.09 to Minn. Stat. § 237.07.

The December 11 Order is corrected to change the reference from Minn. Stat. § 237.07 to Minn. Stat. § 237.09.
