TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:

RCW 19.405.130 directs the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission or UTC) and the Washington Department of Commerce (Commerce) to convene a workgroup to examine issues relating to the implementation of the Clean Energy Transformation Act, chapter 288, Laws of 2019, and integration of the law with clean energy and climate policies and energy and carbon markets in different jurisdictions. This examination will help inform the adoption of administrative rules by the agencies.

The agencies convened an initial workshop on October 24, 2019, to discuss with interested stakeholders the composition and scope of this workgroup. On October 28, 2019, the agencies issued a notice inviting nominations for membership and proposals for educational topics and presenters. Stakeholders nominated a set of individuals that represent a broad set of interests, and the agencies appreciate the level of interest and expertise evidenced in those nominations.
