## TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:

On November 8, 2021, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) issued a Notice of Opportunity to File Written Comments in Docket UE-210804 soliciting feedback from interested persons on Commission staff's (Staff) investigation to determine whether additional guidance related to the cost-effectiveness of distributed energy resources (DERs) is necessary. Staff intends to develop a jurisdiction-specific test for DERs that incorporates the goals of the Clean Energy Transformation Act. Staff's investigation will follow the process and principles described in the National Standard Practice Manual For Benefit-Cost Analysis of Distributed Energy Resources (NSPM). The Commission has held two virtual workshops, on May 10 and August 1, 2022, addressing stakeholder feedback and discussing applicable policy goals and current practice of cost-effectiveness analysis.

The Commission will convene a third two-hour virtual workshop Tuesday, September 20, 2022, at 1:00 p.m. to discuss utility system impacts and non-utility system impacts to include in a primary test.

In preparation for the workshop, the Commission requests that interested persons review the NSPM Part II: DER Benefits and Costs and be prepared to identify and discuss specific impacts.
