Mr. Hayes will address the approval by the local public transportation benefit authority in Kitsap County, Kitsap Transit, and its endorsement of the proposed commercial ferry service to be linked to the ground offerings of Kitsap Transit within Kitsap County. As an agency "eligible to, or operating" commercial passenger-only ferries, Mr. Hayes will be asked to assess the impact on his agency of the grant of this Application and some of the specific reasons for Kitsap Transit's support for the Application.
- D. Ray Deardorf. Ray Deardorf, Director of Planning for the Washington State
 Ferry System, will also be asked to assess the impact of the proposed Application on the
 Washington Department of Transportation which included the Washington State Ferry System.
 Recognizing his agency's role in this action is currently a contested legal issue in the
 proceeding by virtue of the Staff's pending Petition for Interlocutory Review, Mr. Deardorf's
 testimony will be presented without regard to any pending Commission ruling on interlocutory
 review at Order No. 2, should the issue remain unresolved. Mr. Deardorf will be questioned on
 the overall impact upon his agency of the launch of the proposed commercial passenger-only
 ferry service, and why the Washington State Ferry System eliminated its previous proposal to
 expand the use of commercial passenger-only ferry service on the Kingston-Seattle and other
 prospective Puget Sound routes. Mr. Deardorf will also be asked to put into context the
 financial and operational impact of this proposed service on the Department of Transportation
