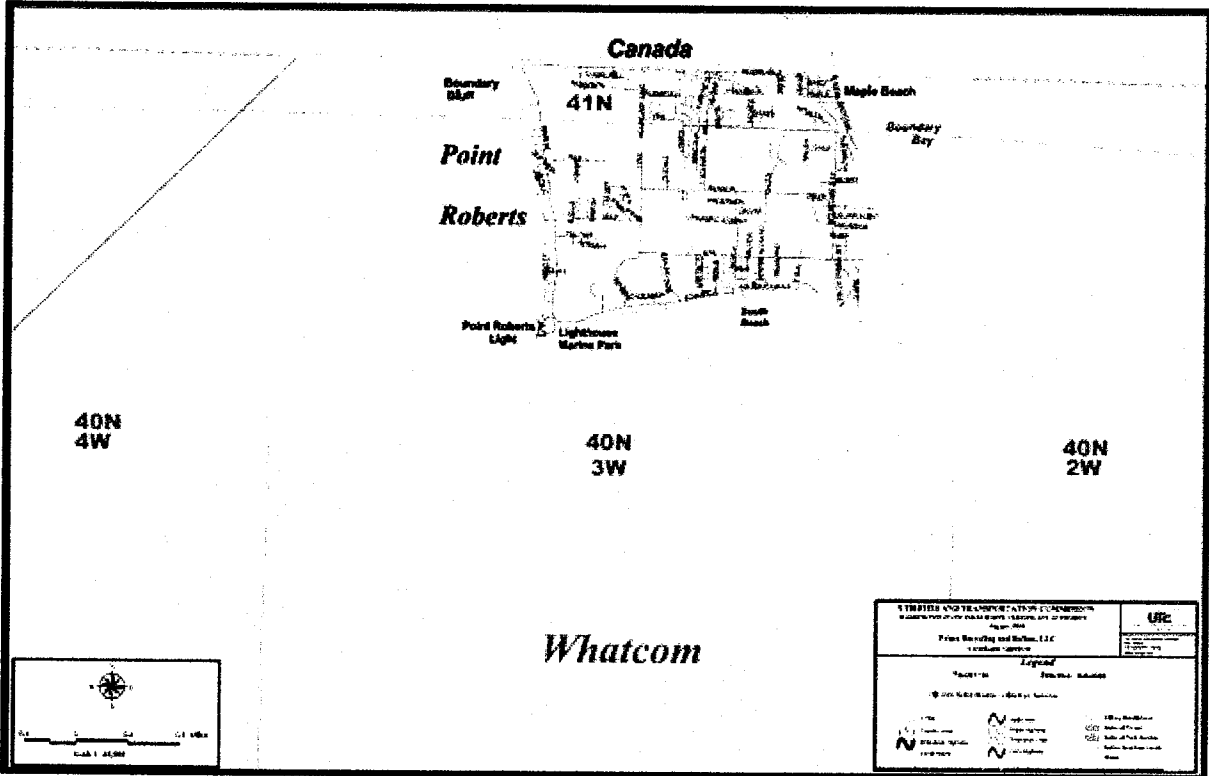

In view of the June 17th, 2009 "FINAL ORDER GRANTING REQUEST TO CANCEL CERTIFICATE AND CLOSING DOCKETS WITHOUT FURTHER ACTION AS MOOT" referring to consolidated Dockets TG-080913; TG-081089; and TG-082129 and the resulting cessation of service outlined in Points Recycling and Refuse's Service termination customer letter of May 28, 2009, it is clear that Point Roberts, Washington will no longer have a company certified to collect solid waste and recyclables from residents and businesses alike.

Self haul of solid waste and recyclables in any community, regardless of size or location is a daunting task for residents and businesses. Not to mention the issue of potential health hazards resulting from the buildup of solid waste in any given location without due care and attention. The long term absence of regularly scheduled curbside solid waste collection can only create a potential for disaster, particularly in an isolated community such as Point Roberts. The economic wheels of Point Roberts depend on maintaining an efficient and well managed solid waste system that pays attention to the needs of the community and works within the confines of the Federal, State and County laws.

We there for submit that there is a need for a "Solid Waste Collection Company" to service the community of Point Roberts. That company must also comply with Whatcom County code which mandates the provision of curbside recycling for all residences. It is our intention to take these matters to another level and, if the application is granted its certification, provide commercial recycling services. We feel that this action will actually reduce the amount of solid waste being collected in Point Roberts significantly and will allow us to increase the awareness of proper recycling practices consistent with those being taught in our schools.

I have been involved in the transportation industry for the majority of my business life.

I spent two years as a freight courier with Bankers Dispatch Corporation.

I spent a year driving buses for Trailways Northwest

I was with Brink's Canada Limited for 15 years in various capacities including driver; Manager; Area Manager and Assistant Regional General Manager as well as Regional Sales Manager for Western Canada.

I was Executive Administrator and Vice President of Kenneth L Kellar Truckline, dba Mobile Armored for 7 years.

I have operated Fire department apparatus for in excess of 17 years as a volunteer, and administered EVAP Training as Fire Chief for 10 years.

I am also the managing partner of a dump trucking operation, and have been for some 4 years.

I have held a CDL with endorsements for approximately 30 years in Canada and the USA.

In these capacities I have had to maintain records for safety and operations of varying sizes of trucks. These have included driver safety programs; log books; accident prevention programs; maintenance and inspection programs; random controlled substances and alcohol abuse testing; Hazmat programs; public relations; customer satisfaction; and customer service.

The listing on the application does not really provide for enough information and there for we submit the following for your consideration.

This is a start up business and therefore a balance sheet or profit and loss statement is unavailable. We have however prepared a budget to outline rough income and expenses. Some of these numbers are based on information provided by the previous certificate holder's filings with the WUTC which are a matter of public record. We feel that the information contained in this budget is conservative and that the revenues will be slightly higher and quite possibly we will, have lower expenses than those stated. Additionally, as the recycling component of the business grows, and global economics start to recover, there will be a return on recyclable materials which will certainly add to the bottom line.

In completing this application and preparing the tentative budget , it is clear that this operation only has the components of success contingent upon receiving the lease of the Whatcom County owned transfer station situated in Point Roberts at Johnson Road. In his open letter to Point Roberts citizens, Whatcom County Public Works Department Director, Frank M. Abart seems to indicate that once a solid waste collection company is certified then the county will negotiate a lease with that new company. This will be essential in order to operate with a margin of success. Revenue quoted is based upon the transfer station income and usage.

While we have had \$10,000.00 in our bank account since it opened in August of last year, we will be adding to that in the amount of \$30,000.00. Additionally we have secured short term (5 years) private financing in the amount of up to \$50,000.00.

We feel that we will be able to manage payments on our short term financing through our Facility, Equipment and Vehicle depreciation accounts of \$3750 per month.

Applications for USDOT and Operating authority have been filed electronically with the FMCSA and copies are attached hereto. Although we are not in receipt of it at this time, an electronic filing of our BOC-3 has been conducted. We will forward that in follow up for your files. A copy of the UCR application is also attached and will be submitted with the required fee. We are awaiting a submission from our insurance broker to finalize our process with the USDOT.

It is our intention to manage all operational matters in Point Roberts, and contract out any hauling of solid waste From Point Roberts, to contract carriers. It is not our intention, at least initially, to buy unnecessary equipment when basic fundamental service will meet the needs of this community. Our efforts will be directed towards customer service and garnering community support. This will be done primarily through direct contact with community groups and individuals. We hope that this approach will allow us to expand on our customer base.

We are also intending on contracting out our accounting services to a local contractor who will come to our offices and perform our billing, payroll, tax remittals and regulatory reporting functions. This individual is familiar with county government as they perform bookkeeping services for both the Fire and Water Districts here in Point Roberts. It is our intention to use industry designed software in order to streamline accounting and reporting activities.

Expanding into commercial recycling will be necessary in order to expand the recycling base of materials in Point Roberts. Currently a significant amount of recyclable material is land filled because no one has taken the time to educate the general public, including the businesses.

We also enclose for your information and records, a copy of our "TRANSPORTATION OF RECYCLABLE MATERIALS REGISTRATION" which has been sent to the Washington State Department of Ecology.

Open Letter to Citizens of Point Roberts

RE. Cancellation of Points Recycling and Refuse, LLC Garbage Collection Certificate

Dear Community Member:

The purpose of this letter is to communicate Whatcom County's response to the pending cancellation of garbage collection services at Point Roberts. Yesterday, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (WUTC) granted a Points Recycling and Refuse, LLC request to suspend garbage collection as of July 1, 2009.

Solid waste collection is a highly regulated private enterprise that is governed by state law and overseen by the WUTC. Commercial solid waste collection companies must qualify for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity by WUTC in order to provide collection services. Certification is required so that WUTC can ensure that collection is performed by companies capable of delivering satisfactory service at fair and equitable rates. **Whatcom County does not certify collection companies or provide collection services.**

WUTC is currently soliciting applications from prospective companies to collect garbage and recycling at Point Roberts. As of Wednesday, June 17, the WUTC had received no applications for a certificate. One party from Point Roberts has communicated its intent to apply.

Whatcom County owns the **Johnson Road transfer station**. The County has historically leased the landfill to the certified garbage collection company serving the Point Roberts franchise area. The County's ability to stipulate the terms and conditions of the transfer station lease allows the County to influence operation of the facility. Through that mechanism, Whatcom County Public Works can work to provide uninterrupted service at the facility.

To that end, Whatcom County Public Works intends to secure the services of Point Recycling and Refuse at the transfer station temporarily during the transition in collection service. It is our current plan that the temporary lease will remain in effect until a solid waste collection company is certified to operate in the Point Roberts franchise area, or for six months, whichever is sooner. If no collection company is certified by September 1, 2009, the County will prepare a Request for Qualifications and select a qualified firm to operate the transfer station under a long-term lease.

Residents should **arrange to self-haul garbage and recycling to the transfer station beginning July 1, 2009 and thereafter**, unless and until a qualified collection company is certified by WUTC to serve Point Roberts.

Continued curbside collection at Point Roberts depends on success of the private sector. My staff and I have met with several certified collection companies to explore ways to reduce the operational barriers to service at the Point. The principal barriers are (1) turnaround time for solid waste disposal (garbage cannot be imported to Canada, so containers must be transported to Bellingham through two border crossings), (2) the small number of collection customers, and (3) recent contraction of recycling markets. There are no ready solutions to these problems; however, I will continue to work with industry and the community towards a more sustainable business environment.

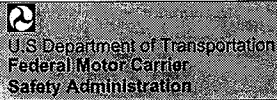

Until we are sure that our application will proceed, we are not keen on purchasing equipment which will not be of any use to us. Should we be faced with the need to expedite the purchase of equipment, we will take all necessary measures to secure equipment within the State of Washington.


