ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION

By application filed with the Commission on March 6, 1959, the applicant, The Washington Water Power Company, seeks to amend its present Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Operate a Gas Plant for Hire to include the operation of a gas plant for hire in the City of Colfax, Washington, and environs. Applicant at present is certified to operate a gas plant for hire in Spokane, Medical Lake, Cheney, Pullman, Clarkston, Asotin and in the general areas adjacent to those cities and towns.

The company's original application encompassed not only the City of Colfax, but practically all the area of Whitman County south of Colfax and east to the Idaho state line. By letter of March 18, 1959, the company amended its original application to encompass only an area of twelve square miles including the City of Colfax and adjacent territory.

Applicant is the only company which has requested a certificate to supply gas service to the Colfax area; an area where there is presently no natural gas service available. The company has secured a franchise to operate a gas plant for hire from the City of Colfax.

The Washington Water Power Company is presently providing natural gas service to Spokane and various other cities and towns in Washington and Idaho, including Pullman, Washington, which is about 17 miles from Colfax. The company also supplies electric service in Colfax as well as many other communities in Washington and Idaho.

It is estimated the cost of constructing a gas system in the Colfax area will be about \$100,000. The applicant expects to finance the construction costs from treasury funds. The applicant should have no trouble in obtaining an adequate supply of natural gas for the Colfax area from the Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corporation. The pipeline company's Lewiston lateral line passes within a half mile of Colfax.

While the Commission might question the economic feasibility of providing natural gas service at reasonable rates in Colfax as an independent and separate operation such operation appears to be economically feasible as an adjunct to the applicant's present gas and electric operation in its service area.

Moreover, in view of its experience in supplying gas service in its presently certificated area, the company should be capable of providing adequate natural gas service in the Colfax area at reasonable rates. Accordingly, it would be in the public interest to have natural gas service made available in the Colfax area by applicant.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Washington Water Power Company operates a gas plant for hire in this state and is subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.
- 2. The Washington Water Power Company seeks to amend its present Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Operate a Gas Plant for Hire in Spokane, Medical Lake, Cheney, Pullman, Clarkston, Asotin and the general areas adjacent to those cities and towns to encompass the City of Colfax, Washington and environs.
- 3. The area sought to be incorporated into the present certificate of convenience and necessity is in close proximity to the applicant's Pullman, Washington, gas service area.
- 4. At present there is no gas company operating a gas plant for hire in the requested area.
- 5. The Commission has no other applicant requesting certification for the area sought by The Washington Water Power Company.
- 6. The Washington Water Power Company presently holds a franchise from the City of Colfax for the operation of a gas plant for hire in that city.
- 7. The Washington Water Power Company is capable of financing the installation of plant facilities to make gas service available in the area sought to be certificated.
- 8. The Washington Water Power Company should be able to obtain an adequate supply of natural gas from the Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corporation.
- 9. The operation of a gas plant for hire by The Washington Water Power Company in the Colfax area as proposed is or will be required by the public convenience and necessity and the company's Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity should be amended to include the area described and shown in Appendix A-6.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED That the application of The Washington Water Power Company to amend its present Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Operate a Gas Plant for Hire be amended to encompass the following additional area:

All of the incorporated area comprising the City of Colfax and additional portions of Whitman County, Washington, adjacent thereto lying within the described area as follows:

Beginning at the NE corner T 16 N, R 43 E, W.M.; thence South approximately four miles along the East line of T 16 N, R 43 E, W.M. to the SE corner of Sec. 24, T 16 N, R 43 E, W.M.; thence West approximately three miles along the South lines of Secs. 24, 23 and 22, T 16 N, R 43 E, W.M to the SW corner of Sec. 22, T 16 N, R 43 E, W.M.; thence North approximately four miles along the West lines of Secs. 22, 15, 10 and 3, T 16 N, R 43 E, W.M. to the NW corner of Sec. 3, T 16 N, R 43 E, W.M.; thence East approximately three miles along the North line of T 16 N, R 43 E, W.M. to the NE corner of T 16 N, R 43 E, W.M., the point of beginning.

As shown on Appendix A-6 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity issued pursuant to Order paragraph No. 1 above, supersedes and cancels Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 6, issued to The Washington Water Power Company on the 10th day of September, 1958. Said certificate of September 10, 1958, should be forthwith returned to the Commission.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That the certificate issued pursuant to Order paragraph No. 1 above is subject to the terms, conditions and provisions of the orders in Cause No. U-8889, effective October 19, 1956; Cause Nos. U-9021, U-9022 and U-9023, effective May 5, 1958; Cause No. U-9052, effective August 21, 1958.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That jurisdiction over this cause is retained to effectuate the provisions of this order.







Rural area with very light dwelling density.


