- NATURE OF PROCEEDING. Docket UT-093035 involves a petition by Qwest Corporation (Qwest) for arbitration and approval of an interconnection agreement (ICA) with North County Communications Corporation of Washington (North County) pursuant to 47 U.S.C. §252(b) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996 (Telecom Act).
- 2 **CONFERENCE.** The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) convened a prehearing conference in this docket at Olympia, Washington on March 8, 2010, before Administrative Law Judge Adam E. Torem.
- 3 **APPEARANCES.** Lisa A. Anderl, Associate General Counsel, Seattle, Washington, represents Qwest. Chris Reichman, Dicks & Workman, APC, San Diego, California, represents North County.
- 4 **STATUS OF NEGOTIATIONS.** The parties confirmed that during the last several months they have made no substantive progress toward negotiating a mutually agreeable settlement of the outstanding issues in this matter. Further, North County

has expressed its intention to file a motion to dismiss the proceeding, challenging the Commission's jurisdiction to conduct arbitration under the Telecom Act in this case.¹

5 RESPONSE TO PETITION BY NORTH COUNTY COMMUNICATIONS.

North County has not yet filed a formal response to Qwest's Petition. In accordance with Section 252(b)(3) of the Telecom Act, the Commission did not require North County to file an Answer. *See* Order 01, ¶ 9. At the conference, Qwest requested that North County file a responsive pleading formally identifying the remaining disputed issues in this docket. North County agreed to file its Answer to the Petition if the Commission does not grant North County's motion to dismiss.²

PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE. In light of the parties' failure to timely negotiate an agreement, the Commission determined that a procedural schedule for motions and an evidentiary hearing should be set. The parties agreed on a procedural schedule during the conference. The Commission adopts the parties' agreed procedural schedule as set forth below and in Appendix B to this Order.

Tuesday, July 13, 2010, and Wednesday, July 14, 2010 (if needed)

As noted at the conference, the Commission does not wish to deviate from this slow-paced and deliberate schedule. The Commission will not grant continuances or otherwise postpone deadlines except upon a formal motion showing good cause and demonstrating the absence of prejudice to the other party and the Commission, as required by WAC 480-07-385.

- NOTICE OF HEARING. The Commission will hold a hearing on the merits of this matter, to begin on Tuesday, July 13, 2010, at 9:30 a.m., in Room 206 of the Commission's headquarters, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington. The hearing will continue and be completed, as needed, on Wednesday, July 14, 2010, in the same location.
- ARBITRATOR'S REPORT AND DECISION. In accordance with WAC 480-07-630(11)(b), the deadline for the arbitrator's report and decision would normally have occurred on Monday, November 23, 2009.³ Further, under Section 252(b)(4)(C) of the Telecom Act, the deadline for those same decision documents would have occurred on Wednesday, November 25, 2009.⁴ The agreed procedural schedule proposed by the parties and adopted herein will obviously not allow compliance with these already lapsed regulatory deadlines.
- The parties have not formally agreed to waive the legally required date for issuance of the arbitrator's report and decision. However, through repeated requests to postpone the initiation of the arbitration process, the parties have adequately demonstrated their amenability to waiving these regulatory deadlines. Therefore, in light of the parties' agreed proposed schedule, **the Commission sets Friday, September 3, 2010, as the**

deadline for issuance of the arbitrator's report and decision.⁵ If any party objects to this date for the Commission's required action under Section 252(b)(4)(C) of the Telecom Act, they must timely file and objection in accordance with the guidance below. In addition, the Commission requests that the parties file formal waivers of the above-noted regulatory deadlines no later than Friday, March 19, 2010, so that the record is clear on this matter.⁶

- DOCUMENT PREPARATION, FILING REQUIREMENTS, AND ELECTRONIC DOCUMENT SUBMISSION. As noted in Order 02, ¶¶ 9-12, parties must file an **original plus three** (3) paper copies of all pleadings, motions, briefs, and other prefiled materials. The parties are directed to re-familiarize themselves with the requirements set out in that order as well as in WAC 480-07-140, WAC 480-07-145, WAC 480-07-395 and WAC 480-07-460.
- NOTICE TO PARTIES: Any objection to the provisions of this Order must be filed within ten (10) days after the service date of this Order, pursuant to WAC 480-07-430 and WAC 480-07-810. Absent such objection, this Order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to commission review.
