**TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:**

On June 1, 2022, Avista Corporation d/b/a Avista Utilities (Avista), PacifiCorp d/b/a Pacific Power & Light Company (PacifiCorp), and Puget Sound Energy (PSE) (collectively Companies) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) reports concerning progress in meeting the Companies' respective conservation targets during the preceding biennium.

These reports are required by WAC 480-109. WAC 480-109-120(5) provides that Commission Staff and all interested persons may comment on these reports within 30 days of the utility's filing.

The Commission will consider the reports and any comments it has received at its recessed open meeting on **Tuesday, July 26, 2022, at 10:00 a.m.** The Commission will be holding the

meeting virtually. Commission headquarters will not be open to the public for in-person participation. The Commission requests that comments be provided in electronic format to enhance public access, for ease of providing comments, to reduce the need for paper copies, and to facilitate quotations from the comments. - The docket number of this proceeding (rename all dockets, with Company names).
- The commenting party's name.
- The title and date of the comment or comments.

Comments should be in .pdf format (created using Adobe Acrobat or comparable software) or in Microsoft Word. The Commission will post on its website all comments it receives in electronic format. The website is located at [www.utc.wa.gov](http://www.utc.wa.gov). Documents are generally posted within 24 hours of receipt.

The Commission will consider all comments and determine whether to render a decision at the open meeting or to engage in additional proceedings. Upon conclusion of its review of the conservation reports, the Commission will determine whether the Companies have acquired enough conservation resources to achieve compliance with their 2018-2019 biennial

conservation targets. For the renewable portfolio standard plan reports, the Commission will decide whether the Companies correctly calculated their 2020 renewable resource targets and complied with their reporting requirements.
