TO ALL PARTIES:

On July 8, 2020, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) entered its Final Order (Order 08) in the above-captioned dockets, which resolved all of the contested issues in Puget Sound Energy's (PSE or Company) general rate proceeding. Order 08, among other things, requires PSE to file:

- a disconnection reduction plan within one year of the effective date of Order 08,
- an annual report for the purpose of analyzing and monitoring disconnection trends, and
- a report that itemizes actual costs for community action agencies to administer PSE's energy assistance programs.

On July 8, 2021, PSE filed a Disconnection Reduction Plan, a report on disconnection for data in calendar year 2019 (Disconnection Report), and a report on actual costs for community action agencies to administer PSE's energy assistance programs (Energy Assistance Program Cost Report). PSE subsequently filed addenda to the Disconnection Reduction Plan on August 13 and October 11, 2021.

On December 1, 2021, Staff filed a letter in this docket stating that it believed that PSE had complied with Commission's expectations for the reports listed above as set forth in Order 08.

The Commission has reviewed the Disconnection Reduction Plan with its addenda, the Disconnection Report, and the Energy Assistance Program Cost Report and finds that PSE has complied with the expectations set forth in Order 08 regarding those reporting requirements.
