The NW Energy Coalition (the Coalition) read with interest the proposal that UCONS submitted into Puget Sound Energy's (PSE) 2018-2019 Biennial Conservation Plan (BCP) docket, UE-171087. The NW Energy Coalition supports all utility efforts to acquire all cost-effective conservation, and we recognize that there may be customer groups that need additional assistance or differing program design in order to acquire these savings. In addition, we recognize and value the nonenergy benefits that conservation can provide, including air quality and health benefits and reduced utility bills.

The Coalition was not involved in the development of this proposal from UCONS, but as a member of PSE's Conservation Resources Advisory Group (CRAG), we encourage PSE to review this proposal and consider whether this approach or a similar one could help serve manufactured home residents with low incomes, who are not already being served by PSE programs or through community action agencies.

If PSE does move forward with such a program for this market, we would encourage the Company and any contractors to coordinate closely with existing low-income service providers to ensure that there is no duplication of service and that served residents are also made aware of the other low-income services available to them. The Coalition would also encourage the Company to include more comprehensive weatherization measures in the visit, so that there are fewer lost opportunities once a contractor is servicing a home.

I am happy to discuss this proposal and PSE's views at a future CRAG meeting.
