Avista Corporation, dba Avista Utilities (Avista), respectfully submits, in support of the agreement discussed in the January 10, 2018 Commission Open Meeting, a revision in to its “2018-2019 Biennial Conservation Plan (BCP) Target.” The revision changes the Company’s 5% decoupling goal from 3,989 MWh to 4,489 MWh. The Company has agreed to calculate its decoupling goal off of the “total” target, including savings attributed to NEEA. The table below reflects the agreed upon changes to the Company’s 2018-2019 Biennial Conservation Plan (BCP) Target.
