4	proceeding in this room involving the same court

14	MR. FASSIO: Staff believes this does qualify
15	as the type of filing that would be appropriate to
16	invoke discovery.
17	JUDGE WALLIS: Does Staff intend to pursue

19	MR. FASSIO: We have no position on that.

21	invoked, then we do want to have a protective order
22	issued.
23	JUDGE WALLIS: Do you intend to pursue
24	discovery if discovery rules are invoked?
25	MR. FASSIO: Yes.

1	JUDGE WALLIS: So we will invoke the
2	discovery rules and will enter a protective order.
3	Have the parties discussed among themselves a potential
4	procedural schedule?
5	MR. FASSIO: We have not.
6	JUDGE WALLIS: Let's go off the record,
7	please, for a discussion of scheduling.
8	(Discussion off the record.)
9	JUDGE WALLIS: Let's be back on the record,
10	please, following a scheduling discussion. The
11	parties have agreed on the following schedule for this
12	proceeding: Initial written prefiled testimony is due
13	in the Commission offices no later than June 30.
14	Answering testimony from Commission staff is due on
15	July 17th, and rebuttal, if any, from the Company will
16	be due on July 31.
17	The hearing is scheduled for one day to be
18	held in the Commission offices on August 15th. Briefs
19	will be simultaneous briefs from the parties due on
20	Tuesday, September 12th. Because the issues are
21	relatively limited and it is not expected that parties
22	will need a great deal of time to address issues, we
23	are setting a reply brief, a deadline for one week
24	after the initial briefs on the 19th of September.
