## NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT

(Comments due by 5 p.m. on October 10, 2022)

RE: Developing a Commission jurisdictional specific cost-effectiveness test for distributed energy resources incorporating CETA, Docket UE-210804

TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:

On November 8, 2021, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) issued a Notice of Opportunity to File Written Comments in Docket UE-210804 soliciting feedback from interested persons on Commission staff's (Staff) investigation to determine whether additional guidance related to the cost-effectiveness of distributed energy resources (DERs) is necessary. Staff intends to develop a jurisdiction-specific test for DERs that incorporates the goals of the Clean Energy Transformation Act. Staff's investigation will follow the process and principles described in the <u>National Standard Practice Manual For Benefit-Cost Analysis of Distributed Energy Resources</u>. The Commission has held three virtual workshops, on May 10, August 1, and September 20, 2022, addressing stakeholder feedback and discussing applicable policy goals, current practice, utility system impacts, and non-utility system impacts.

As a follow-up to the September workshop, the Commission requests that interested persons file written comments by October 10, 2022. Staff will use the information provided to develop a straw proposal of a jurisdictional specific test for discussion at the next workshop.

Attached to this notice is a template titled "Utility Detail Template" to further describe current utility practices around how impacts are valued for DERs. This template also surveys for areas where there may be a lack of data or materiality and begins exploring possible alternative methods of inclusion. Staff requests that each electric and gas utility fill out this template in its entirety.

All interested persons should address the impacts in the table below and indicate if each is applicable for the following DERs:

a) Energy Efficiency

- b) Demand Response
- c) Distributed Generation
- d) Distributed Storage
- e) Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment
