**Topic:** Archuleta Testimony (Geo-Targeting, LIW, Co-Deployment, Demand Response, Workforce Development, CBIs and Metrics)

Witness Archuleta testified about the importance of “leveraging” state and federal funds for Low-Income Weatherization. GA-1T at 10:5–8. Is it PSE’s position that PSE cannot increase funding for its LIW program as proposed by Mr. Colton without jeopardizing access to state and federal funds that support this program?

**Response:**

No, that is not Puget Sound Energy’s (“PSE”) position. PSE can and does increase funding for its Low-Income Weatherization Program. PSE has a long-standing agreement with The Energy Project (“TEP”) and contracted housing authorities and social service agencies that they may request additional PSE dollars throughout the course of a program year to meet agency production capacity.
