l	I, Neiri Carrasco, under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of Washington, decla	are
	as follows:	

- I am over 18 years of age, a resident of the state of Washington, and competent to be a witness.
- 3 I am employed by the Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) as a Regulatory Services Director.
- Staff began engaging with Energy Exemplar and PacifiCorp in contract discussions in December 2023 within 60 days of the date of the Commission's final order in this Case. Staff engaged with Energy Exemplar and PacifiCorp in contract negotiations through March 2024, working to fund the purchase of four (4) full or partial licenses for Staff to use the PLEXOS model, including reasonable development, training, and support provided by Energy Exemplar to train Staff how to use and operate the software.
- The cost of four intervener licenses is \$. The cost for one intervener license is \$. This is a significantly higher cost than Staff expected at the time it negotiated for the four licenses.
- 6 Staff believes the difference between the cost of one license versus the cost of four licenses is very significant. Ultimately, PacifiCorp may pursue cost recovery of these costs, which the Commission may allow to be passed down to rate payers.
- At this time, Staff believes that we could still achieve the same results with fewer than four licenses. However, Staff will revisit its licensing needs after the contract period proposed in the present contract.
