## Chris.

In reviewing the proposed language of 480-30-022 I see the words "A passenger transportation company *may* contract......" no where do I see that the UTC is compelling TNC's to come under the regulatory authority of the commission. If all of this work is just so that we can dilute our safety and insurance standards and heir "contractors" then I feel that this has been a colossal waste of time, effort and money. It strikes me as superfluous regulation particularly in that the proposal requires that each vehicle be covered under a limo or for heir DOL license. With either of those licenses the operator has no need to interact with the commission. Also just FYI, the DOL does not offer a "limousine Chauffer" license for drivers.

Now it is very possible that I am not interpreting the proposed language correctly and it is the intent of the proposal that <u>ALL</u> passenger transportation, including the TNCs be brought under the regulatory authority of the commission which, if the commission truly is concerned with leveling the playing field, is the only course of action that would begin to do so. If in fact that is the case how will taxi/for heir companies be dealt with?

Presuming that DOL will shoulder some of the regulatory burden is fanciful thinking. They have no functioning enforcement division and consequently their "investigators" have no incentive to follow up on gross violations.

This all being said, for the moment I have one question that needs be answered right away:

Does the commission propose to regulate TNCs under this modification to 480-30? Please answer either <u>yes</u> if so and point out the language that creates this regulatory authority, or <u>no</u> and then offer an explanation as to how the proposed language is in our or the public's best interest.

Thank you for clarifying this for me. You answer will help me prepare for the May 11, 2017 work shop.
