- PacifiCorp d/b/a Pacific Power & Light Company (PacifiCorp) on October 3, 2006, filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) revisions to its currently effective Tariff WN U-74, designed to effect a general rate increase for electric service. The stated effective date for the revised tariff is November 2, 2006. PacifiCorp requests an increase in annual revenues from Washington operations of \$23.2 million, resulting in a proposed increase in rates of 10.2 percent. The company based its filing on a test period consisting of the twelve months ending March 31, 2006. PacifiCorp requested the early entry of a complaint and order suspending the proposed tariffs and waived any objection to the process by which the suspension order might be entered. The Commission suspended operation of the tariffs by Order 01 entered in this docket on October 10, 2006.
- STATUTORY AUTHORITY: The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under Title 80 RCW and has legal authority to regulate the rates, services, and practices of electric utilities. The statutes that apply to this matter include chapters 80.01, 80.04 and 80.28 RCW, including but not limited to RCW sections 80.01.040, 80.04.020, 80.28.020, 80.28.030, 80.28.070, 80.28.090, and 80.28.100. The rules that apply to this matter include those within chapters 480-100 WAC, relating to electric companies.

The Commission will hear this matter under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), particularly Part IV of chapter 34.05 RCW relating to adjudications. The provisions of the APA that relate to this proceeding include but are not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.422, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.434, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. The Commission will also follow its procedural rules in chapter 480-07 WAC in this proceeding.

- The Commission finds there is good cause to hear this matter shortened notice consistent with the requirements of WAC 480-07-440(1)(a).
- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That it will hold a prehearing conference in this matter at 1:30 p.m., on Tuesday, October 17, 2006, in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.
- The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider requests for interventions, resolve scheduling matters including establishing dates for distributing of evidence and work papers, to identify the issues in the proceeding and determine other matters to assist the Commission in resolving the matter, as listed in WAC 480-07-430.

 Parties are encouraged to consult informally prior to the prehearing conference to develop a proposed schedule for the Commission's consideration.
- INTERVENTION: Persons who wish to intervene should file a petition to intervene in writing at least three business days before the date of the prehearing conference as provided in WAC 480-07-355(a). The Commission will consider oral petitions to intervene during the conference, but strongly prefers written petitions to intervene. Party representatives must file a notice of appearance with the Commission no later than the business day before the conference as required by WAC 480-07-345(2). If any party or witness needs an interpreter or other assistance, they should fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission. The Commission will set the time and place for any evidentiary hearings at the prehearing conference, on the record of a later conference or hearing session, or by later written notice.

THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440. The Commission specifically invokes the sanction provisions of WAC 480-07-450 which allow the Commission to seek penalties for a party in default.
