**Part A Petitions for Reconsideration and Notice of Date for Commission Action**

4 Public Counsel and Qwest each filed a petition for reconsideration of the Commission's 13<sup>th</sup> Supplemental Order (Part A Order). Parties may file answers to the petitions for reconsideration of the Part A Order no later than February 28, 2001. Any request for an extension of time to file an answer must be filed no later than February 26, 2001. Requests for extension of time may be fax filed provided that a paper copy is filed the next business day.

5 Petitioning parties may file a reply to the answers no later than March 9, 2001.

6 In accordance with WAC 480-09-810 (6), the parties are hereby notified that the Commission will act on the petitions on or before April 9, 2001.

**Part C Schedule -- Microwave Rooftop Collocation**

9 The Part A Order directed parties to address microwave collocation costing issues in Part B of this proceeding; however, after further discussion with the parties it appears that there is insufficient time for the parties to fully prepare and present these issues under the current schedule. Costs associated with microwave rooftop collocation will

be addressed in Part C of this proceeding. The Part C filing and hearing dates are as follows:

### **Winstar Petition for Late Intervention**

11 On February 12, 2001, Winstar filed its Petition to Intervene. At the prehearing conference the Commission found that Winstar's petition is late-filed. On February 20, 2001, Winstar filed a supplement to its petition to intervene. Parties may file responses to the petition no later than February 27, 2001.

### **Number of Commissioners Presiding at Hearing**

12 There are two sitting commissioners until such time that a third commissioner is appointed. It is possible that scheduling conflicts may arise during the Part B hearings and one commissioner or the other may be unavailable. Parties must file objections to conducting any portion of the hearing with one commissioner presiding no later than February 28, 2001.

### **Part B Filing Deadlines**

13 Parties are encouraged to review filing requirements and deadlines set forth in the Twelfth Supplemental Order in this proceeding.

14 **NOTICE TO PARTIES: Any objection to the provisions of this Order must be filed within ten (10) days after the date of mailing of this document, pursuant to WAC 480-09-460(2). Absent such objections, this prehearing conference order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to Commission review.**
