I. SYNOPSIS

The Commission revokes the registration of 82 registered telecommunications companies for failure to pay regulatory fees and file annual reports.

II. PROCEDURAL BACKGROUND

- 1 On December 5, 2002, Commission Staff opened this docket as part of its yearly review of annual reports and regulatory fees for telecommunications companies registered to do business in the state of Washington. As a result, Commission Staff identified the telecommunications companies listed on Attachment A as not complying with requirements to file annual reports and pay regulatory fees for 2001. On December 31, 2002, Staff caused a notice to be served by registered mail to each company listed on Attachment A at the last known address in the Commission's records. The notice informed each telecommunications company that, according to Commission records, the company had not complied with requirements for 2001.

- 2 The notice also informed each telecommunications company that if the company wanted to avoid revocation of its registration, within thirty days after service the company must either file an annual report and pay regulatory fees for 2001 or request a hearing to demonstrate why the company's registration should not be revoked. On February 20, 2003, Commission Staff filed an affidavit and supporting documents declaring that each of the telecommunications companies

listed on Attachment A had failed to respond to the notice of impending registration revocation, and Staff requested that the Commission revoke those registrations.

III. RELEVANT STATUTES AND COMMISSION RULES

3 RCW 80.04.080 requires public service companies to furnish annual reports to the Commission in such form as the Commission may require.

4 WAC 480-120-033 states that the Annual Report of Local and Competitive Telecommunications Companies shall be filed with the Commission no later than May 1 of the succeeding year.

5 RCW 80.24.010 provides that, on or before the date specified by the Commission for filing annual reports, each company is to pay to the Commission the appropriate regulatory fee.

6 WAC 480-121-060 allows the Commission to revoke a registration, after notice and opportunity for a hearing, for good cause. Good cause includes failure to file an annual report or pay regulatory fees.

IV. FINDINGS OF FACT

7 (1) The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission is an agency of the state of Washington, vested by statute with authority to regulate rates, rules, regulations, practices, accounts, securities, and transfers of public service companies, including telecommunications companies.

8 (2) On December 31, 2002, Staff caused a notice to be served by registered mail to each telecommunications company listed on Attachment A at the last known address in the Commission's records. The notice informed each telecommunications company that, according to Commission records, the company had not complied with the requirements to file annual reports and pay regulatory fees for 2001.

- 9 (3) The notice also informed each telecommunications company that if the company wanted to avoid revocation of its registration, within thirty days after service the company must either file an annual report and pay regulatory fees for 2001 or request a hearing to demonstrate why the company's registration should not be revoked.
- 10 (4) Each of the telecommunications companies listed on Attachment A failed to respond to the notice of impending registration revocation.
- 11 (5) Each of the telecommunications companies listed on Attachment A failed to file an annual report and pay regulatory fees for 2001.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12 (1) The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this proceeding and all parties to this proceeding.
- 13 (2) In accordance with RCW 80.04.080, WAC 480-120-033, RCW 80.24.010, and WAC 480-121-060 the registration of each of the 82 telecommunications companies identified in Attachment A should be revoked in the state of Washington for failing to file annual reports and to pay regulatory fees.

VI. ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS That:

- 14 The registration of each of the 82 telecommunications companies in the state of Washington identified in Attachment A is revoked for failing to file annual reports and to pay regulatory fees as required by RCW 80.04.080, WAC 480-120-033, and RCW 80-24.010.
