RE: AMS Moving & Storage of Portland, Inc.'s application for authority

Dear Mr. Anderson:

As you are aware, the Utilities and Transportation Commission ("commission") entered an order on November 25, 2008, stating its intention to cancel the temporary authority to move household goods in Washington, previously granted to All My Sons Moving & Storage of Portland, Inc. ("AMS") by the commission on July 11, 2008. The primary reasons included AMS's documented history of consumer complaints in Oregon and its common ownership with All My Sons Moving & Storage of Seattle, Inc., against which the commission took enforcement action. Prior to hearing, in your December 16, 2008, letter, you informed the commission that your client was withdrawing its application and "requests that the application be dismissed and that its temporary authority permit number THG-63303 be terminated."

On June 3, 2009, your client reapplied for household goods permit authority. Though the commission continues to have reservations about AMS's fitness and ability to provide moving services in Washington, the commission has decided to grant your client's application on a temporary basis, not to exceed six months, after which the commission will conduct an audit of AMS.

Your client should receive the temporary permit early next week.
