- 1 On January 21, 2011, Northwest Moving Services, Inc., and Northwest Moving & Storage, Inc., filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a joint application to transfer permanent household goods carrier authority in the state of Washington under RCW 81.80 and WAC 480-15.
- 2 Northwest Moving Services, Inc., has dissolved and the interest is being transferred to the majority shareholder, Northwest Moving & Storage, Inc. The application includes statements supporting a transfer of permanent authority under WAC 480-15-335(1)(f). Northwest Moving & Storage, Inc., is fit, willing and able to provide the proposed service and it appears that the requested transfer of permanent authority will not be detrimental to the interests of the public.
- 3 The Commission, having considered the application and being fully advised, finds that it would be in the public interest to grant the application for transfer of household goods carrier permit HG-25594 to Northwest Moving & Storage, Inc., under WAC 480-15-335.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 4 (1) The application filed in this docket to transfer permanent household goods authority in the state of Washington from Northwest Moving Services, Inc., to Northwest Moving & Storage, Inc., is granted.

- 5 (2) Household Goods Carrier Permit HG-25594 is reissued to Northwest Moving & Storage, Inc.
- 6 The Commission has delegated authority to the Secretary to enter this Order under RCW 80.01.030 and WAC 480-07-905(2)(a).

NOTICE: This is an order delegated to the Secretary for decision. In addition to serving you a copy of the decision, the Commission will post on its Internet Web site for at least 14 days a listing of all matters delegated to the Secretary for decision. You may seek Commission review of this decision. You must file a request for Commission review of this order no later than fourteen (14) days after the date the decision is posted on the Commission's Web site.

The Commission will schedule your request for review by issuing a notice of hearing to be held before an administrative law judge. The Commission, at its discretion, may consider your request for review in an adjudicative proceeding under RCW 34.05 Part IV, or in a brief adjudicative proceeding under RCW 34.05.482 through .494. Following hearing, the administrative law judge will enter an initial order. If you wish to seek review of the initial order, you may file a petition for administrative review under RCW 34.05.464, or if the matter is heard in a brief adjudicative proceeding, under RCW 34.05.491.

The Commission will grant a late-filed request for review only on a showing of good cause, including a satisfactory explanation of why the person did not timely file the request. A form for late-filed requests is available on the Commission's Web site.

This notice and review process is pursuant to the provisions of RCW 80.01.030 and WAC 480-07-904(2) and (3), and WAC 480-07-905, as amended effective September 22, 2008.
