RE: Notice of Intent to Send to Collections, Penalty Assessment No. TV-111126

Dear Sir or Madam:

As you are aware, on July 12, 2011, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission issued a Penalty Assessment against 5 Star Movers and Delivery LLC (5 Star Movers) in the amount of \$100 for violation of WAC 480-15-480, which requires household goods carriers to file an annual report with the commission by May 1 each year. 5 Star Movers failed to file its annual report for 2010 and has incurred a penalty of \$100. The commission sent 5 Star Movers a Second Notice on January 31, 2012, and a Final Notice on March 7, 2012.

The commission has not received the \$100 payment due and owing.

This is to notify you that the commission intends to forward your outstanding debt to a collection agency for collection. You likely will incur additional expenses and fees, including costs of collection, attorney's fees, and interest. These expenses and fees will be added to your outstanding \$100 balance.
